

2020 STATISTICS OF QUOTA/APPLICATION/ADMISSION BY FACULTY (DEGREE)



2020 UTME ADMISSION STATISTICS OF SCIENCES AND ARTS (NCE)







INFRACTIONS IN THE ADMISSION PROCESS

"I made Mistake"

- ✓ It is called "I made Mistake"
- ✓ Candidate initially upload genuine O' level results to JAMB on CAPS
- ✓ Upload fake result with higher grades to the portal of the institution
- ✓ The fake result boost the ranking of the candidate at the institution
- ✓ The fake result is then substituted with genuine one (with lower grades)
- ✓ JAMB spot-checked and accused the institution of manipulation Unilorin 2019 experience at registration point
- ✓ Results provided on CAPS are to be used for ranking
- ✓ It will be downloaded by the institutions
- ✓ No candidate is required to do any other upload until he/she is admitted
- **✓** Result Download by institutions from CAPS has been made mandatory

Skipping of Merit Candidates

CLAIM

- A candidate wrote to the Board that University of Benin denied her admission to Doctor of Pharmacy
- The University claimed it was as a result of quota

FACT

- The candidate has all requirements to be admitted on merit
- She ranked as one of the best 30 for the programme
- We adjusted the quota by two spaces to be able to accommodate her because two other candidates who took her place had accepted admission

Quota of Regulated Programmes - Manipulation by Institutions



Some institutions took undue advantage to manipulate quota of regulated programmes during preparation of parameters to admit candidates more than the approved capacity

Institutions involved were sanctioned and admissions carried out reversed

Misleading the Board to Increase Quota

CLAIM

Ignatius Ajuru University of Education wrote to the Board to reverse admission of 151 candidates who had not accepted admission so that it would be able to replace them and conclude admission exercise

FACT

- When we checked on CAPS, 116
 candidates had accepted
 admission out of the 151
- JAMB will not reverse the admission until candidates are contacted individually
- We could have tempted to extend the window for the University to admit more but for the check and contact to individual candidates

Adjustment of Merit Cut-Off Mark

Request

- ✓ Abia State University requested for adjustment Merit Cut-Off of some highly subscribed programmes without following derivation formula
- ✓ The University was educated

 Merit cut-off is derived and not imposed

The Need to verify Students' Credentials Before Graduation An Eye- opener by Prof. Muhammad Yahuza Bello

- ✓ Bayero University usually verify the credentials used by students to gain admission before such students are allowed to graduate
- ✓ Those found to have used forged/altered qualifications (after following due process, including giving them the opportunity to defend themselves) are expelled by Senate in accordance with University Regulations
- ✓ A memorandum (research paper) by former Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Prof. Yahuza shows that of the 148 students who were already admitted into the University with IJMB results, only 8 were found to be genuine
- ✓ The University Senate expelled all the 40 students after establishing beyond any doubt that the qualifications they used to gain admissions were fake. Some disturbing observations were made on the forgeries
- ✓ The numbers of students coming with fake/forged documents from the same "institutions", and the similarities of the forgery are indications that some syndicate(s) might be involved in producing such fake documents.
- ✓ Forged entry result does not correlate with grades obtained by the candidate in internal examinations
- ✓ Most institutions these category of candidates claimed to have attended do not exist.
- ✓ Forgeries have the tendencies of causing unrepairable damage to the nation's education system




2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN




GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN




GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN & GENDER



2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (TOP TEN)




2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (LOWEST TEN)




2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY FACULTY








GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2021 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF EXAMINATION







ADVISORY ON CANDIDATES' O' LEVEL DOWNLOAD BY ADMISSION OFFICERS

The Board observed during the 2020 Admissions Exercise that the O'level results which candidates upload on CAPS for JAMB verification were different from the one uploaded on institution's portal by the same candidates. In order to address the issues, the Board has added a new feature to strengthen the reliability of CAPS and making the 2021 admissions process easier. This feature ensures compliance with Federal Government ease of doing business because once the candidates upload into CAPS, it is automatically transferred to the institutions upon download. This will also eliminate some of the pranks currently being played by candidates which they mischievously refer to as "I made mistake".

This advisory is to notify the institutions on the process of downloading the list of candidates together with the O' Level details of the candidates on CAPS before initiating the process of admission for any programme. The steps are:

- As an admission officer, click on "Download First Choice", then click on "Download O' level Result" menu.
- 2. The page as attached (Appendix 1) comes up after step 1 above and the process below followed which can also be seen on the attached:
 - a. Select a particular program to download O 'level results of candidates in the program.
 - b. Click on the "View" button
 - c. The O' Level results of candidates in the program will be displayed in the grid view.
 - d. Click on the excel icon to download the O' Level results.

Please note, Admission Officers will not be able to admit candidates into any program using the "Admit Candidate" page, unless the O 'Level results of candidates has been downloaded for that program.

No institution would be able to finalise admission exercise until after cut-off date

ADDITIONAL FEATURES ON CAPS (cont'd)



No institution would be able to move candidates into merit level unless ALL positive candidates above him/her are admitted either by merit, catchment or ELDS

After upload of O' level by a candidate, any admission to be done MUST consider him/her





If any institution request for opening of change for programme or institution, it MUST consider all the candidates who have uploaded



2021 ADMISSION TIMELINES AND CALENDARS





PROFILE TRANSACTION UNDUE INFLUENCE/THIRD-PARTY INTERFERENCE

- ✓ The Board has banned all third-party interactions on its portal for any of its services
 - cases have been reported with conflicting authorisation for changes on candidates' data, majorly between candidates and their parents or guardians
- ✓ Fraudsters taking advantage of the naivety of some candidates to collect their vital access codes to effect unauthorised changes on their profiles
- ✓ Consequently, nobody, including parents or guardians or any proxy, would have access to transact any business on candidate's profile because fingerprint (or OTP) would be required

JAMB SUPPORT SYSTEM – TICKETING Reminder!!!

- ✓ candidates no longer need to travel to JAMB offices to access certain services.
- ✓ The Board uses the 'ticketing system' where a candidate or anybody desiring the Board's services can send their complaint(s).
- ✓ Responses are given within 24 hours.
- ✓ It has a tracking number that is issued once a ticket is raised. If not attended to, the number can be use as evidence to track the officer scheduled who would be sanctioned
- ✓ The system is designed to eliminate any stress associated with accessing the Board's services

2022/2023 JAMB BROCHURE REVIEW (Using IBASS)

- ✓ Now automated and electronic-online through IBASS (Integrated Brochure & Syllabus System)
- ✓ Access point: www.jamb.gov.ng
- Each institutions has secured access credentials it will collect through its registered e-mail address on CAPS

- ✓ Each institution views its present requirements & makes online request for amendment, deletion or addition on the platform
- ✓ All approved requests would be communicated vide the platform provided it is within the approved guidelines of the respective Regulatory Agencies (NUC, NBTE or NCCE)

Reminder!!!

advantage

✓ JAMB received requests for lowering of minimum scores from institutions as a waiver to allow candidates to be admitted through CAPS

- ✓ Institutions should take advantage of IBASS
- ✓ Make a realistic requests including UTME subjects combination & O' level credit passes
- ✓ Remedial students must also have minimum institutional score
- ✓ Head of institutions or Registrars should personally make such requests
