NASS COMMENDS JAMB ON MMESOMA'S MATTER



On Wednesday, 15th May, 2024, the House of Representatives considered the report of the ad-hoc committee and made far-reaching recommendations.

The public will recall the much-publicised case of Miss Ejikeme Mmesoma, who fraudulently altered her 2023 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) score from 249 to 362 in order to give credence to her false claim of having the highest overall score in the 2023 UTME

in Nigeria.

What she did was to simply superimpose her dream score, which had no relation to what was actually in the records of the Board. Furthermore, a petition was forwarded on her behalf to the House of Representatives which consequently constituted an ad-hoc committee to investigate the matter and subsequently made seven recommendations to the effect that:

- Miss Mmesoma Joy Ejikeme should cooperate with JAMB to ensure that all those who conspired with her are identified;
- Members of the public should always verify results through the issuing authorities when in doubt of what is presented to them by candidates seeking patronage of any kind;

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2025 UTME REGISTRATION: JAMB TO LAUNCH CUSTOMISED SIMs FOR CANDIDATES

As part of measures to address the perennial challenges of theft or missing Subscriber Identity Module (SIM), the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has concluded arrangements to partner with the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC) to issue UTME candidates with customised phone Sims for UTME registration.

The Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, explained this during the visit of a delegation of the West Africa Civil Societies Forum (WACSO) to his office on Thursday, 27th June, 2024, in Abuja. According to the Registrar, the customised SIMs would only be used for UTME registration and would be accessible to only the parents with an expiry date of five years. He expressed

- iii. JAMB should be commended for its watertight examination processes and procedures, transparency, innovations and record-keeping system, all of which made it possible to retrieve unmutated records of interactions with candidates at short notice;
- iv. The system adopted by JAMB through which candidates do not present their results directly to their chosen institutions but had to rely on the results JAMB had earlier sent to their chosen institutions, is commendable and should be emulated by employers of labour to reduce falsification of results;
- v. JAMB should reconsider the three-year ban placed on Miss Ejekeme Joy Mmesoma considering the possible negative impact the ban may have on her career and future prospects given the fact that she is a first offender and had been remorseful;
- vi. JAMB should engage the public more through enhanced awareness and sensitization programmes so as to educate members of the public on its procedures and activities. In this regard, the committee finds it very assuring that the Board's high ethical standards had helped to clear any perceived negative perception about the institution; and
- vii. The House of Representatives should support and strengthen such institutions like JAMB through enhanced budgetary allocations in order to improve their capacity to continue to provide quality services to Nigerians.

The Board welcomes the diligent investigation by the House of Representatives as it considers the recommendations by the committee as the right step going forward. It also assures the National Assembly and the general public that it will continue to put in its best to ensure that its processes guarantee fairness

and equity without fear or favour.

On the earnest desire of the House to offer needed support, the Board requests that six (6) Professional Test Centres per annum be constructed by the Federal Ministry of Education and handed over to JAMB in order not to divert the Board's attention from its core purpose to contract monitoring. This will go a long way towards increasing the number of CBT centres across the country thereby making its services more readily available to candidates in different parts of the country especially in the rural areas.

The wedding ceremony, which took place on Saturday, 22nd June, 2024, at the ECWA Goodnews Church, Kubwa, Abuja, was graced by family,

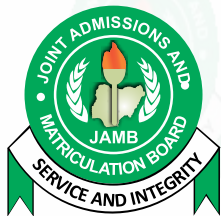

NEW TELEGRAPH, MONDAY, JUNE 24, 2024: FG to Spend N3bn on 70, 000 Students' Tuition Fees:- The Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) is set to disburse N35 billion as tuition fees to 70,000 students in federal tertiary institutions whose loan applications have been approved. Additionally, another 50,000 applications are being evaluated for potential approval within the next 30 days. This initiative is expected to benefit at least 1.2 million students across 124 federal tertiary institutions. According to a source at NELFUND, the Federal Government has allocated N3 billion for disbursement across these institutions. The source clarified that while NELFUND continues to receive applications from federal institutions, it will soon expand to include state institutions. The application portal will remain open 24/7 to accommodate the varying academic calendars of each school, and the funds are expected to be disbursed shortly.

NEW TELEGRAPH, TUESDAY, JUNE 25, 2024: JAMB to Announce Cut-Off Marks July 18:- The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has announced a national policy meeting on July 18, 2024, to determine the admission cut-off marks for tertiary institutions in the 2024/2025 academic year. The meeting, chaired by the Minister of Education, Prof. Tahir Mamman, will convene critical stakeholders, including the National University Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE), National Council for Colleges of Education (NCCE), heads of tertiary institutions, and representatives from the National Youth Service Corps (NYSC).

The agenda for the national policy meeting includes the presentation of reports on the recent Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) and ongoing Direct Entry (DE) applications, addressing unresolved issues from the previous academic year and evaluating stakeholders' compliance with existing advisories and guidelines

as well as suggesting necessary amendments. The meeting aims to set minimum cut-off marks for admissions and deliberate on other matters related to the admission process. NEW TELEGRAPH, TUESDAY, JUNE 25, 2024: Ex-Caleb Varsity Don, Becomes Africa's First Archival Science and Diplomats Professor:- Elvis Efe Otobo, a former GST lecturer and Acting Director of Public Relations, Protocol and Marketing at Caleb University, Lagos, has been appointed as Africa's first Professor of Archival Science and Diplomats at Ballsbridge University, Dominica. His dual appointment in 2022 as both Associate Professor and Full Professor at Ballsbridge University highlights his exceptional expertise and impact in the field. Prof. Otobo emphasizes the importance of records management, archival science, and related fields in the Records and Information Management ecosystem, both locally and globally. He notes that Ballsbridge University is a dynamic international academic centre known for innovative approaches to education, including open learning, online blended transitional learning, and virtual learning. Currently leading the largest online platform for archives and records management professionals at the University of Plymouth, UK, Prof. Otobo's publications in renowned journals and extensive unpublished research papers have significantly contributed to the advancement of Archival Science.

PUNCH, TUESDAY, JUNE 25, 2024: Number of Nigerians Who Can't Read, Write, Disheartening-Minister:- The Minister of State for Education, Dr Yusuf Sununu, expressed concern over the high number of young Nigerians and adults who lack basic literacy skills, describing it as "disheartening." According to reports, a significant 31%

of Nigeria's population is illiterate. Speaking at a national stakeholders' engagement in Abuja, Sununu emphasized the urgent need to significantly reduce youth and adult illiteracy rates in Nigeria. He stressed that acquiring basic literacy skills is crucial for national development, noting that no country has achieved sustained economic growth without at least 40% of its adults being literate. The Minister acknowledged literacy as a fundamental right and the foundation for lifelong learning. The Executive Secretary of the National Commission for Mass Literacy, Adult and Non-Formal Education, Akpama Simon Ibor, concurred that youth and adult illiteracy are the root causes of the alarming out-of-school children phenomenon in Nigeria.

NEW TELEGRAPH, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 26, 2024: Student Loan: NELFUND Extends Application Process for State-Owned Institutions:- The Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) has announced a 14-day postponement of the student loan application process for state-owned tertiary institutions due to incomplete data submissions. According to a statement, the delay is attributed to some schools' failure to upload required student data and fee information to the NELFUND Student Verification System (SVS). The application window, initially scheduled to open on June 25, will now commence on July 10, subject to no further unforeseen circumstances. As of now, only a limited number of state-owned institutions have successfully submitted data, including 20 state universities (out of 48), 12 state colleges (out of 54), and two state polytechnics (out of 49). While acknowledging the efforts of these institutions, NELFUND emphasized that the remaining state institutions' failure to submit data poses significant challenges to ensuring a seamless and accurate verification process for student loan applicants. This extension aims to provide additional time for state

DAILY TRUST, THURSDAY, JUNE 27, 2024: School Principals Converge on Abuja, Brainstorm on Education Standards:- The All-Nigeria Confederation of Principals of Secondary Schools (ANCOPSS) gathered in Abuja for their 66th Congress, focusing on enhancing teaching and learning in Nigeria. FCT Minister Nyesom Wike, represented by Dr. Danlami Hayyo, urged principals to prioritize re-enrolling out-of-school children nationwide. The Administration reaffirmed its commitment to improving education standards and producing students with academic excellence and character. Procurement processes are underway to establish a new university in the FCT, upgrading education infrastructure. Wike commended FCT students' digital proficiency but emphasized the need for principals to instil hard work values and combat cybercrime ("Yahoo Yahoo"). ANCOPSS National President Alhaji Muhammad Ibn Musa pledged dedication to raising post-primary education standards through effective methodologies. He emphasized the importance of entrepreneurship education, urging principals to mentor students in this field, aligning with global trends.

DAILY TRUST, THURSDAY, JUNE 27, 2024: NElfund Board Meets on Disbursement of Student Loan:- The Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) has approved the disbursement of student loans to successful applicants, marking a significant milestone in its mission to provide financial aid to students. Amba criticized the decision, stating that TRCN plays a vital role in developing the teaching profession in Nigeria. "TRCN is responsible for professionalizing teachers in primary, secondary, and tertiary institutions. It's alarming that the federal government has decided to cut funding for the council," he said. He emphasized that it's unprecedented for a regulatory body responsible for overseeing the teaching profession to receive no funding. The exercise was marked by enhanced security measures, resulting in the apprehension of impersonators who were handed over to law enforcement agencies for investigation and prosecution. JAMB will continue to deploy technology to prevent examination infractions. Candidates were advised to check their supplementary UTME results by texting "UTMERESULT" to 55019 or 66019 using the same phone number used for registration.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Entrepreneurship education is the collection of formalised teachings that informs, trains and educates anyone interested in participating in the socioeconomic development of the society through any project that aims at promoting entrepreneurship awareness, business creation or small business development.

entrepreneurship studies developed as a follow-up to the declaration of the United Nations on Entrepreneurship in 2005 and its adoption by the Nigerian Government in 2006. The National University Commission (NUC), as a consequence, started a mandatory entrepreneurship development course for all undergraduates before graduation in 2007. This measure is to address the problem of graduate unemployment and strategically position the economy for sustainable development.

The philosophy underscoring the undergraduate B.Sc. entrepreneurship programme in Nigerian universities is to develop a

crop of broadly-educated entrepreneurial professionals. Through this programme, students are exposed to the most recent research and theory in international business, market research, promotion, advertising and many more. It also focuses on business opportunities exploitation, business plan development and control, start-up establishment, management, team-building, market strategies, human resource management, leadership, innovation, intellectual property, economy, networking, market research, among others.

A career in this field is lucrative on account of the upward trend in unemployment among graduates. To venture into entrepreneurship, business owners are trained on how to set up and manage start-ups (small or medium-scale enterprises). Graduates of entrepreneurial programmes can also work in private and government-owned establishments, industries, research institutions, academia, banks,

schools, etc. It is a four-year course under the Faculty of Administration in most of the nation's universities.

UTME subjects required include Use of English, Economics, Mathematics, and any of the trio of Accounts, Government or Geography. O' level requirements include a credit pass in English Language, Mathematics, Economics and any two Art or Social Science subjects. For special waivers from institutions, check the brochure at www.ibass.jamb.gov.ng.

Universities that offer Entrepreneurship include Bayero University, Kano, University of Benin, Obafemi Awolowo University, among other federal, state and private universities. The professional body is the Institute of Professional Entrepreneurs and Strategic Administrators of Nigeria (IPESA-Nigeria) for the purpose of promoting standards and values of the profession in Nigeria.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON - REGULAR PROGRAMMES

**This advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of
applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.**

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institutions in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
4. JAMB, as a responsive organisation, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by respective institutions.

In his welcome address, the leader of the STEAM team, Prof. Obioma Nworgu, expressed the commitment of the Board to the course of fostering STEAM education in the country and pledged the collaboration of the three educational bodies for greater output.

The advocacy programme witnessed the participation of teachers selected from the 21 Local Government Areas of the State as well as students drawn from selected primary and secondary schools in the State.

The topics covered by the representatives of the various bodies at the workshop included: Strength and Weaknesses of Current STEAM Education Policies; Introduction to Integrative STEAM Education; Importance of STEAM Education; Overcoming Challenges in STEAM, and Relevant Tips for Preparing Students for UTME.

In her presentation, Dr. Aminat Egberongbe, Psychometric Department, JAMB, gave relevant tips for preparing candidates for the UTME. In her captivating presentation, she outlined the step-by-step procedures for the registration of candidates, spell out examinations infractions, as well as programme selection procedures for admissions into tertiary institutions, among others.

The highlights of the programme included the presentation of gifts to the participating students, mentorship and live demonstration of Computer-Based Test (CBT) to the students, who were drawn from Old GRA Primary School; Redeemers Lutheran Primary School; Karewa Primary School, Nyibango Primary School; Bekaji Government Junior/Senior Secondary School, Old GRA; Government Day Secondary School, Karewa; General Murtala Mohammed College; Foundation Academy and Government Girls Secondary School, Yola, among others.

ILLEGAL ADMISSIONS, AN EMBARRASSMENT TO THE NATION – OLOYEDE



The Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has stated that illegal admissions of candidates into tertiary institutions in the country is an embarrassment and a disservice to the nation.

Prof. Oloyede made the disclosure on Tuesday, 25th June, 2024 when he hosted the delegation of the Committee of Pro-Chancellors of State Universities in Nigeria (COPSUN) in his office, at the National Headquarters, Bwari, Abuja.

"Some 'graduates' had never entered the four walls of a university owing to the endemic corruption in the system but the Board had documented over 3000 of such cases," he stated.

The Registrar, therefore, charged COPSUN to ensure that they clean the Augean stables by ensuring that they clamp down on underhand admissions, which is not only detrimental to the system but is also disadvantageous to the image of the country.

The Chairman, COPSUN, Sen. Joshua Lidani, thanked the Registrar for their warm welcome. According to him, COPSUN needed no introduction as the Registrar was familiar with the body and what it stands for over the years.

Sen. Lidani commended the Registrar for all his support to the

body over the years and also lauded him for the creation of a formidable and a more credible assessment organisation. He added that as a world-class institution, the Board had leveraged on appropriate technology to upscale its operations. He recalled the situation prior to the coming of the Registrar when results would take several weeks before they would be released compared to the almost instantaneous system that obtains now.

Speaking further, the COPSUN Chairman also commended the Registrar for exposing the loopholes in the assessment system that had enabled nefarious characters to exploit the system for their own ends. He, therefore, urged the Registrar to sustain the tempo as these characters are still waiting in the wings to exploit any slightest opportunity.

Additionally, he lauded the Registrar for generating revenue to the coffers of government and subsequently remitting huge sums of money in the process. He, therefore, charged him to sustain the tempo for other similar MDAs to emulate.

He stated that they are ready to offer necessary support to the Board as stakeholders in the system and that by so doing, they could help to reposition the educational system for better service delivery.

"COPSUN could, indeed, do more,

were it not for the paucity of funds, among others". He, however, reiterated that, COPSUN was ready to offer support in more ways than one especially with respect to bringing down the rate of examination malpractice.

He further implored the Board to channel some funds to the state universities sector to ameliorate some of their financial challenges as they have limited resources compared to the almost limitless resources at the disposal of their federal counterparts.

Sen. Lidani also used the opportunity of the visit to intimate the Board of the upcoming biennial conference of the body and extended an invitation to the Registrar to grace the occasion.

Additionally, he solicited the support of the Registrar in both material and intellectual terms towards organising a successful conference.

Earlier in the Registrar's opening remarks, he disclosed that the Board's campaign against underage admission was anchored on the need to align the nation's educational sector with international best practices. He added that elsewhere, it is the age that determines the class a student belongs not his intellectual endowment.

Prof. Oloyede also acknowledged the funding challenges facing state-owned universities. He decried such as capable of destroying the fabric of the educational system in the country. He agreed that assisting COPSUN is tantamount to helping the nation in general to thrive and succeed and promised to table the solicitation for support to the Management of the Board for necessary action.

The Registrar also used the opportunity afforded by the meeting to inform the COPSUN delegation of the upcoming 2024 Policy Meeting slated for 18th July, 2024.

PLACEMENT OF OBITUARY ADVERTISEMENT ON BEREAVED STAFF OPTIONAL – JAMB

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has stated its willingness to always adhere to the provisions of the Civil Service regulations and advisories with respect to the payment of burial expenses especially as it affects the placement of obituary adverts on bereavement.

According to the Board, an obituary advertisement serves as a notice

that a person is deceased with the intention of bringing it to the notice of the public, person's friends or distant family members, who may not have heard the news of his/her demise. It, however, noted that a formal acknowledgement or announcement is at the prerogative of the family of the deceased as the Board has always paid the cost of obituaries advertisement alongside burial expenses to the family

members of the deceased.

However, going forward, any staff who prefers the advertisement can so indicate and the amount would be deducted for the placement of the advertisement.

WASCOF IN JAMB, SAYS INNOVATION CONTRIBUTING TO INTEGRITY OF CERTIFICATES

The West African Civil Society Forum (WACSOFF) has commended the various initiatives taken by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) stating that such landmark achievements have, no doubt, impacted on the integrity of certificates awarded in the nation's tertiary institutions.

The Deputy National Coordinator of WACSOFF, Dr. John Adeniyi, gave this commendations when he paid a courtesy visit to the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, in his office in Bwari, Abuja.

The West African Civil Society Forum (WACSOFF) is a platform for the aggregation of civil society agencies, interests, and interventions across the 15 States of the West African sub-region founded in 2003 with the sole purpose of channelling civil society energies towards complementing the regional integration and development agenda of the ECOWAS system institution.

Furthermore, Dr. Adeniyi commended the Board for its proactive stance with regard to its test administration practices, pointing out that the feat recorded was capable of contributing to the integrity of certificates awarded through such a process saying only ICAN is comparable to the Board's administered UTME.

He urged the Registrar not to relent in his efforts till he brought the menace of examination malpractice to zero.

According to him, the mission of the delegation was to explore areas of collaboration with the Board to realise its mandate and consolidating on the gains and achievements recorded.

Adeniyi also commended the Board for its rapid and sustained infrastructural development as well as its adherence to international best practices, examination integrity, credible university admission process, and technologically-driven admission policy that gives equal opportunity to all admission seekers.

On the controversies surrounding the age limit of potential UTME candidates, the Deputy National Coordinator, WACSOFF decried such practices adding that such youths could be exposed to post-secondary schools skills acquisition programmes prior to their

admission into universities.

Dr. Adeniyi also lauded the adoption of the CBT mode of testing by the Board noting that the approach had significantly curtailed examination practices, while advocating the establishment of CBT centres in each Local Government Area to boost candidates' access to examination centre.

Dr. Adeniyi similarly commended the Board for its extensive networking with stakeholders adding that this is necessary for wide-ranging consultation and engagement.

In his remarks, the Registrar thanked the WACSOFF delegation for their visit and urged the organisation to bring up its programmes and activities for closer scrutiny.

 Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.

 The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

ADVERTORIALS

 Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.

 It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell “application forms” for admissions into the programmes listed above. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
