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

The policy meeting, attended by Vice-Chancellors of Universities, Rectors of Polytechnics, Monotechnics, and Innovation Enterprise Institutes, Provosts of Colleges of Education, and other critical stakeholders, will consider and approve the guidelines for the 2024 admission exercise. The meeting will review the performance of the 2023 admissions exercise and the 2024 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination

(UTME) performance of candidates. The minimum admission scores, an aggregation of individual institutions' submissions, will be approved at the meeting. This is not a cut-off mark, as often misconstrued, but a minimum score that no institution should go below. The decisions made at the meeting, chaired by the Hon Minister of Education, form the guiding norms for admission and are a collective

decision, not solely that of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).

No institution is expected to commence the admission process until after the policy meeting, as the guidelines regulating the year's admission exercise are determined at the meeting with the endorsement of the Hon Minister of Education. The meeting declares the commencement of the year's

admission exercise, setting the grand norms, and any institution that violates these collective norms will face sanctions.

A key rule is that all admissions must be processed through the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS), and any candidate who accepts admission outside CAPS does so at their own risk.

STEAM TRAIN MOVES TO ONDO

s part of efforts to promote excellence and strengthen the Nigerian educational system through Science, Technology Engineering, Art and Mathematics (STEAM) education, the Nigerian Academies of Science & Letters and Nigerian Young Academy in collaboration with the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), have moved their nationwide advocacy from Adamawato Ondo State for a three-day campaign.

The advocacy programme, which commenced in Akure, the state capital, was aimed at creating awareness on the benefits of STEAM education at both primary and secondary education levels in Nigeria. This approach, according to the organisers, was with a view to contributing to the quality of STEAM education through the implementation of engaging

inquiry-based teaching and learning techniques in partnership with JAMB.

In his opening remarks, the STEAM Implementation State Lead, Prof. Duro Oni, Fellow, Nigerian Academy of Letters, emphasized the need to integrate STEAM policies into the Curriculum and Extra-Curricular activities in schools as this would equip students and give them the needed leverage to excel right from the beginning.

Prof. Oni further maintained that the implementation of appropriate STEAM education policies is needed to strengthen the capacity of trained schools' career development and stimulate academic interest, among others.

In his response, the JAMB Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, who was represented by the Zonal Director, Owerri Office, Mrs. Gloria Anyeagbu, stated that Prof. Is-haq Oloyede is the arrowhead of the STEAM project. She also revealed that JAMB is the sole organisation sponsoring the project, which was an indication that Prof. Oloyede is not only interested in the conduct of JAMB examinations alone but is equally concerned about the overall educational progress of the Nigerian child.

In her closing remarks, Mrs. Anyeagbu urged the students to be focused and not be distracted in the pursuit of their chosen careers.

Highlights of the occasion were the motivational talks by selected teachers drawn from various schools across the State, the Questions and Answers segment, Summarisation of tips on Strategies for Success in the UTME, purchase of UTME PIN for Registration, Admissions' Procedures and practical demonstrations of how to sit the UTME CBT, among others.

PREMIUM TIMES, SUNDAY, JULY 7, 2024: Student Loan: Over 100 Institutions Miss Out as NELFUND Commences Second Phase of Applications: - The Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) has announced that only 36 stateowned institutions have complied with the directive to upload their students' data to its platform, thereby enabling their students to benefit from the loan scheme. Consequently, students of these 36 institutions are now eligible to apply for the loan scheme introduced by the Nigerian government to address the challenges faced by Nigerian students in accessing tertiary education.

Regrettably, students of the remaining 115 state-owned tertiary institutions are not yet eligible to apply, as their institutions have failed to upload their data to the NELFUND Student Verification System (SVS). Previously, NELFUND had extended the deadline for the second phase of the application process by 14 days, citing the failure of institutions to upload their students' data. As of two weeks ago, only 34 institutions had complied with the directive.

NELFUND expects to receive student data from 48 state universities, 49 polytechnics, and 54 colleges of education. The agency urges all other state-owned tertiary institutions to submit their complete student data to the NELFUND

Student Verification System on time, ensuring their students can benefit from the scheme. Also in The Eagle, Sunday, July 7, 2024.

DAILY TRUST, MONDAY, JULY 8, 2024: Declining Enrolment in NCE Programmes Threatens COE's Sustainability- NCCE: - Professor Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle, Executive Secretary of the National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE), has expressed concern that the declining enrollment in National Certificate Examination (NCE) programmes at Colleges of Education threatens the sustainability of these institutions and the overall quality of teacher education.

Addressing a retreat for newly inaugurated chairmen and members of Colleges of Education (COE) governing councils in Abuja, Professor Okwelle attributed the enrollment decline to factors such as the perception of teaching as a less attractive career option and competition from other tertiary institutions.

To address this challenge, Professor Okwelle urged the governing council members to adopt a multifaceted approach, including enhancing the appeal of teaching, promoting it as a rewarding and noble profession through targeted campaigns and incentives, and improving the quality of NCE programmes to ensure they

are rigorous, relevant, and aligned with contemporary educational needs.

Professor Okwelle also identified inadequate funding as a significant challenge affecting the development and smooth operation of the colleges, impacting infrastructure development, staff welfare, and the overall quality of education. He emphasized the need to explore innovative ways to secure additional funding and optimize resource utilization.

Furthermore, Professor Okwelle stressed the importance of adhering to the laws establishing Federal Colleges of Education, which provide the framework for governance, operations, and academic activities. Compliance with these regulations ensures consistency, fairness, and integrity in the educational system.

Dr Uchenna Uba, Director of Colleges of Education at the Federal Ministry of Education, representing the Minister of Education, highlighted the significance of the council members' contributions, which will directly impact the development of educators and, in turn, positively transform the minds and futures of many young Nigerians.

To achieve this, comprehensive policies and effective prevention strategies must be implemented. The stakeholders' engagement will address the pervasive issue of sexual harassment on campuses, with a focus on prevention frameworks, to ensure a safe and conducive learning environment for all.

VANGUARD, TUESDAY, JULY 9, 2024: Stop Admission of Underaged – JAMB Warns Universities: – Professor Ishaq Oloyede, Registrar of the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB), has admonished tertiary institutions, particularly universities, to desist from admitting underaged students, describing the practice as "illegal" and "irregular". He emphasized the need to abort such illegal admissions, stressing that accountability, data protection, and the integrity of the nation demand an end to this practice.

Professor Oloyede made this assertion at the opening of the seventh biennial conference of the Committee of Pro-Chancellors of State-Owned Universities in Nigeria, held in Lagos on Tuesday, 9th July 2024. The conference theme was "Effective University Governance: Role of Stakeholders".

He noted that state-owned universities, which constitute a larger number than federal universities, must take decisive action to address this issue. Additionally, he expressed concern over the illegal admission of diploma students, citing the alarming number of 3,000 students from a single university last year, out of a total of 9,000 diploma students admitted. Professor Oloyede

emphasized the importance of accountability, warning that such irregularities can compromise the education system.

LEADERSHIP, MONDAY, JULY 8, 2024: Student Loan: New Hope for NOUN Students: - The National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN) has clarified the misconceptions surrounding student loans for its students. The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Olufemi Peters, has debunked the misleading information that NOUN students are ineligible for the student loan scheme. He attributed the confusion to an earlier misrepresentation by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), which has since been corrected.

According to Prof. Peters, NOUN students are registered with JAMB every semester and possess a JAMB registration number, meeting the major criteria for accessing the loan. He emphasized that NOUN follows the same admission processes as conventional institutions and their students are captured in JAMB's database, making them eligible for the student loan scheme.

This clarification comes after the Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) initially stated that NOUN students were ineligible due to lacking JAMB registration numbers. This caused anxiety among NOUN students who wanted to access the loan to fund their education. Prof. Peters' statement has now cleared the way for NOUN students to participate in the student loan scheme.

DAILY TRUST, WEDNESDAY, JULY 10, 2024: Poor Funding, Strikes Threaten Nigeria's Higher Education- Pro-Chancellors: - The pro-chancellors of state-owned universities in Nigeria have identified inadequate funding and frequent strikes as the major challenges hindering the progress of higher education in the country. At the 7th Biennial

Conference of the Committee of Pro-Chancellors of State-Owned Universities in Nigeria, held in Lagos, Professor Ibrahim Gambari, former Chief of Staff to President Muhammadu Buhari, emphasized the severe funding constraints faced by these institutions.

Professor Gambari noted that state governments, the primary source of funding for these universities, are currently grappling with numerous pressing issues, including insecurity, unemployment, pension payments, and low investments in health and infrastructure. He acknowledged that meeting the needs of universities amidst these competing demands is a daunting task.

To address this challenge, Professor Gambari urged pro-chancellors to establish partnerships with stakeholders to salvage higher education in Nigeria. The conference, themed "Effective University Governance: Role of Stakeholders," aimed to explore strategies for enhancing university governance and addressing the challenges facing higher education in the country.

LEADERSHIP, THURSDAY, JULY 11, 2024: NSSEC, American Mission Team Up to Transform Senior Secondary Education: –The National Senior Secondary Education Commission (NSSEC) has embarked on a groundbreaking partnership with the American Mission to transform Nigeria's senior secondary education sector. Dr. Iyela Ajayi, Executive Secretary of NSSEC, led a delegation to the American Mission, outlining potential areas of collaboration.

Key areas of focus include Teacher training and professional development workshops; Seminars on modern teaching methodologies and classroom management techniques; Exchange programmes for teachers to observe and participate in each other's educational systems; Joint research projects on educational psychology,

pedagogy and technology's impact on learning; and Establishing innovation hubs for developing new teaching methods and learning technologies.

Dr. Ajayi highlighted funding as the Commission's greatest challenge, citing the lack of receipt of the 2% consolidated revenue fund allocated by law. Despite this, the Commission is working with state governments to strengthen legislation establishing State Senior Secondary Education Boards. This partnership aims to revolutionize Nigeria's senior secondary education sector, enhancing teacher capacity, and improving learning outcomes.

LEADERSHIP, THURSDAY, JULY 11, 2024: Federal Gov't to Exempt Varsities from IPPIS, Approves New <u>Varsity for Abuja: - The Federal</u> Executive Council (FEC) has urged swift implementation of its earlier decision to remove public universities from the Integrated Payroll and Personnel Information System (IPPIS) platform. The Council directed the Secretary to the Government of the Federation (SGF) to expedite the process, which was decided several months ago. This move is expected to address a long-standing grievance of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), who opposed IPPIS due to its inability to accommodate unique academic environment peculiarities.

Additionally, the Council ratified the establishment of a new National University of Science and Technology in Abuja, initially approved by former President Muhammadu Buhari on May 28, 2023. This pioneering institution aims to educate and train African scientists and technologists, enhancing the continent's capacity in these fields. It marks the first in a planned network of Pan-African Institutes of Science and Technology.

PUNCH, SATURDAY, JULY 13, 2024: <u>86</u> varsities, others conducted illegal

admissions, says JAMB– Analysis of data on the admissions conducted for the 2022/2023 admission session in Nigerian universities, polytechnics and other tertiary institutions of learning revealed that 88 institutions conducted admissions outside of the Central Admissions Processing System popularly referred to as CAPS.

According to JAMB, admissions conducted outside CAPS are illegal, null and void.

JAMB CAPS which was introduced in 2017 has centralised and automated admission processes between candidates and their chosen tertiary institutions.

In 2020, JAMB warned institutions to stop offering admissions to candidates through their own portals. The board described the practice as a flagrant abuse of the automated Central Admissions Processing System.

In April 2024, the board noted that it would no longer condone illegal admissions conducted outside of the CAPS. The Board in an advisory, published in its weekly bulletin, JAMBULLETIN warned candidates to desist from accepting admissions offered by the institutions without going through it.

Some of the institutions are the University of Uyo, University of Abuja, Olabisi Onabanjo University, Yaba College of Technology, Plateau State University, Ladoke Akintola University of Technology, Federal University of Technology Owerri, Coal City University, Crawford University, Crescent University, Ebonyi State University, Rhema University, Borno State University, Chrisland University, Federal Polytechnic, Nekede, Alvan Ikoku College of Education, and Chukwuemeka Odumegwu University.

THISDAY, WEDNESDAY, JULY 10, 2024: <u>Kwara Varsity Expels 175 Students for Examination Malpractice, Fake Results, Others:</u>
– Kwara State University, Malete, has expelled 175 students for various offences, including examination malpractice, theft, fraud, and possession of firearms. The university's acting Director of University Relations, Dr. Saeedat Aliyu, announced the expulsions, stating that the Students' Disciplinary Committee recommended the penalties after sitting between October 2021 and March 2024. The university reaffirmed its zero-tolerance stance on indiscipline, aiming to produce graduates excelling in both character and learning.

Similarly, Bayero University Kano (BUK) expelled 29 students and rusticated three others for examination misconduct, as reported in the university's official News Bulletin. The decision was made during the 413th Senate meeting on July 3, 2024, in accordance with the university's examination and academic regulations. Fifteen students received warnings. Both universities have demonstrated their commitment to maintaining academic integrity and discipline on their campuses.

JAMB COUNSELS EKITI FEDERAL WORKERS' FORUM ON PROPER UTME REGISTRATION

he Registrar, JAMB, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has counselled members of the Federal Workers Forum, Ekiti State Chapter, on proper UTME registration procedures and its implications for candidates while urging parents and guardians to desist from imposing courses of study on their wards.

The Registrar, who was represented by the JAMB Ekiti State Coordinator, Mr. Hassan Lawal, gave the counsel at the monthly meeting of the Heads of Federal Establishments in Ekiti State held in Ado-Ekiti on Tuesday, 9th July, 2024.

The July edition of the meeting was designed to create awareness ahead of next year's Unified Tertiary

Matriculation Examination (UTME) registration exercise to avoid a recurrence.

In his address, the Registrar identified wrong subjects combination as a major pitfall bedeviling admission seekers on a yearly basis, stressing that knowing the prerequisites before applying for admission would guide the candidates on their choice of career paths.

Furthermore, the Board's helmsman explained the criteria for selecting appropriate subject combinations for registration. He also urged that parents and guardians should be guided appropriately so that they would refrain from imposing particular courses on their wards.

Prof. Oloyede also enjoined candidates to always seek clarifications from JAMB on any JAMB-related matters rather than patronising touts and cybercafé operators, who might end up defrauding them.

In his reaction, the Chapter Chairman, Mr. Isaac Anifowose, Public Complaints Commission, lauded the Board for taking the time to enlighten the Forum and canvassed that the advocacy be replicated in all secondary schools across the federation on a yearly basis to holistically address the issue.

JAMB LAUDS NECO AS IT CONSTRUCTS SIX ADDITIONAL OFFICES IN LAFIA, SOKOTO AND OTHERS

t was excitement galore as the Management of the National Examinations Council (NECO) and the staff of its Lafia State Office, when the Council flags off the construction of additional office accommodation in six additional States of the Federation on Friday, 5th July, 2024.

The symbolic foundation-laying ceremony, which would also take place in Abia, Sokoto, Taraba, Jigawa, Lagos and Rivers States, was attended by the Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board that upon his assumption of duty, he (JAMB), represented by the Ag. bad embarked on a comprehensive Director, Lafia Zonal Office, Mr. assessment of NECO's existing Boniface Ali Tukura. facilities nationwide, which had

Tukura, in his address on the occasion, expressed delight on the commencement of the construction work and wished the Council successful completion of the projects.

Earlier, in his welcome address, the Registrar/Chief Executive, National Examinations Council (NECO), Prof. Dantani Ibrahim Wushishi, stated that upon his assumption of duty, he had embarked on a comprehensive assessment of NECO's existing facilities nationwide, which had revealed a pressing need for infrastructural upgrade as many of the Council's State Offices are housed in rented apartments, often in poorly-equipped and unconducive environments ill-suited for the efficient discharge of its duties.

The National University Commission (NUC), as a consequence, started a mandatory entrepreneurship development course for all undergraduates before graduation in 2007. This measure is to address the problem of graduate unemployment and strategically position the economy for sustainable development.

The philosophy underscoring the undergraduate B.Sc. entrepreneurship programme in Nigerian universities is to develop a

crop of broadly-educated entrepreneurial professionals. Through this programme, students are exposed to the most recent research and theory in international business, market research, promotion, advertising and many more. It also focuses on business opportunities exploitation, business plan development and control, start-up establishment, management, team-building, market strategies, human resource management, leadership, innovation, intellectual property, economy, networking, market research, among others.

A career in this field is lucrative on account of the upward trend in unemployment among graduates. To venture into entrepreneurship, business owners are trained on how to set up and manage start-ups (small or medium-scale enterprises). Graduates of entrepreneurial programmes can also work in private and government-owned establishments, industries, research institutions, academia, banks,

schools, etc. It is a four-year course under the Faculty of Administration in most of tge nation's universities. UTME subjects required include Use of English, Economics, Mathematics, and any of the trio of Accounts, Government or Geography. O' level

and any of the trio of Accounts, Government or Geography. O' level requirements include a credit pass in English Language, Mathematics, Economics and any two Art or Social Science subjects. For special waivers from institutions, check the brochure at www.ibass.jamb.gov.ng.

Universities that offer Entrepreneurship include Bayero University, Kano, University of Benin, Obafemi Awolowo University, among other federal, state and private universities. The professional body is the Institute of Professional Entrepreneurs and Strategic Administrators of Nigeria (IPESA-Nigeria) for the purpose of promoting standards and values of the profession in Nigeria.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular.**

- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- 3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- 5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

CESSATION OF ILLEGAL/IRREGULAR ADMISSIONS

- All applications of admissions to First Degree, National Diploma, National Innovation Diploma and the Nigeria Certificate in Education into Full-Time, Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc., must be processed ONLY through the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.
- It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above.
