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JAMB RELEASES 2025 UTME RESULTS, WITHHOLDS 39,834 RESULTS ...Says the Results Were Not Unusual

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has released the 2025 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) results. The Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, at a press conference held at the Board's National Headquarters, Abuja, on Friday, 9th May, 2025, disclosed that the Board had withheld the results of 39,834

candidates out of the over 1.9 million applicants that sat the examination.

"A total of 39,834 results remain unreleased. Of these, 1,426 results are under scrutiny and processing," he said.

The Registrar pointed out that out of this figure, the results of 96 candidates were withheld on account of established exam

Tunji Alausa, stated this when he featured as a guest on "The Morning Brief", a programme on Channels Television, on Tuesday, 6th May, 2024.

The statement followed growing concerns about the integrity of public examinations, particularly after the release of statistics of the 2025 UTME, which revealed that over 1.5 million of the 1.95 million candidates scored below 200 out of 400.

Speaking on the development, the Minister said the drop in

performance reflects a significant decline in examination malpractice on account of JAMB's tightened security protocols.

"That's a big concern, and it's a reflection of exams being done the proper way."

"JAMB conducts its exam using a computer-based testing system. They've implemented strong security measures, and as a result, fraud or cheating has been completely eliminated. Unfortunately, we cannot say the same for WAEC and NECO. Hence, we have to use

technology to fight this malaise."

"There are so many 'miracle centres' all over the place, and that is simply unacceptable. People cheat during WAEC and NECO exams and then face JAMB, where cheating is nearly impossible. That's the disparity we're seeing now. It's sad," the Minister said.

He also lamented the evils of shady practices during exams stating that "examination malpractice undermines academic integrity and demoralises diligent students."

NEW DIMENSIONS OF EXAMINATION INFRACTIONS WORRISOME - OLOYEDE

The Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has described as, worrisome, the new dimension of examination infractions in the country.

The Registrar stated this at a press conference held to announce the release of the 2025 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examinations (UTME) in Abuja, on Friday, 9th May, 2025.

Prof. Oloyede condemned the attempt of some desperate candidates, who had tried to circumvent due process as well as compromise the integrity and sanctity of the examination delivery system and urged everybody to join the Board in its efforts at combating the malaise.

"New methods of exam fraud were

observed during the registration and examination processes. These include 'WhatsApp Runs', identity fraud, biometric fraud involving combined fingerprints of candidates and impersonators at registration points with the active involvement of some CBT centres, double registration, and attempted substitution of self by candidates.

"Additionally, the 2025 UTME showed the prevalence of some particular types of infractions, which suggests systemic vulnerabilities or gaps in the registration and examination administration and/or monitoring.

"In a desperate bid to tarnish the image of the Board, certain candidates smuggled cameras and phones into the examination hall to capture the live questions on the screen and circulate the images to

others. Those arrested have made useful confessions.

"Also, the alarming trend of candidates resorting to fraudulent websites in search of "assistance" is another cause for alarm. Consequently, 244 results have been withheld on account of candidates engaging in "WhatsApp examination runs," which is a reference to rogue groups promising leaked questions, among other unwholesome services.

Oloyede disclosed that the decision of the Board to withhold the results of this category of candidates is meant to send a clear message to would-be infractors that those who engage in such activities are complicit in wrongdoing, regardless of whether those efforts succeed or fail.

procedure and continue to send incorrect messages, it is unfair to blame the Board for any loss incurred. The Board has made every effort to clearly communicate the process, and a quick online search can provide all the necessary information.

Accusing the Board of exploitation is unjust, as they have worked

diligently to ensure that every candidate can access their results with ease. Please pay attention to the instructions to avoid losing money and to get your results without hassle.

Mr. Sawyerr gave the warning speaking at a stakeholder engagement session/workshop on NELFUND system automation and loan application processes...

Speaking on the challenges, he emphasised that management of higher institutions must be proactive in disbursing funds to beneficiaries once they receive payments from NELFUND.

The JAMB Registrar, Prof. Ishaq

Oloyede, disclosed this on Friday during the official release of the 2025 UTME results at JAMB headquarters, Bwari.

Oloyede revealed that the seizure of results was due to suspected examination malpractices, and about 80 individuals are being probed for exam-related offences with Anambra State having the highest number of suspects. Also in Guardian, Friday, May 9, 2025.

malpractice, a decrease from 123 recorded the previous year.

Oloyede said the Board remained resolute in its determination to eliminate any form of examination malpractice, adding that 1,957,000 candidates were verified to sit the examination, while 71,705 were absent and 2,157 candidates experienced fingerprint rejections owing to suspected registration infractions, a figure he said, was alarming and an unacceptable margin, hence the cases are currently under investigation.

He said, "Subsequent discoveries in this regard indicated that a number of the candidates whose fingers were unrecognised have been found to be involved in registration infractions. Therefore, each of these cases would be reviewed and determined on its merit. Of the 41,027

registered underage candidates, 40,260 sat the examination with their UTME results undergoing further investigation to identify the few, and actual exceptional candidates. Consequently, results for 1,911,551 candidates have been released, which makes the total number of available results to be 1,951,811.

Additionally, Prof. Oloyede disclosed that 3,656 candidates with "extraneous fingerprints" have had their results withheld, while the complicit CBT centres would face sanctions.

He identified the centres as: Tigh Technologies Limited, Sascon International School, Maitama, Abuja; Wudil Computer Information Technology, Wudil, Kano State; and Penta M & Amp, Centre 2, Tambuwal LGA, Sokoto, Sokoto State.

The Registrar also revealed that 80

suspects were being interrogated by the police for their involvement in examination malpractice adding that they would be prosecuted.

"The Board has identified the presence of 'extraneous fingers' in the registration details of some of these candidates. This raises concerns regarding novel strategies for impersonation.

"A total of 3,656 candidates fall within this category. Consequently, the results of the candidates have been withheld.

On the pattern of performance, the Registrar said the results are consistent with the normal trend of UTME results spanning over a decade ago. He, therefore, noted that the results were not unusual, since they aligned significantly with historical patterns of past UTME results.

JAMB CARPETS CRITICS, SAYS INNOVATIONS IN 2025 UTME AIM AT STANDARDIZATION

"The registration process also

revealed areas for improvement, reaffirming our commitment to refining our platforms to ensure a foolproof registration experience, as any compromise or threat in this process could lead to an unreliable examination outcome," he stressed.

We are particularly concerned about the unusual complaints originating from a few states within the Federation. We are currently scrutinising these complaints in detail to identify and rectify any

potential technical issues. To assist in this process, we have engaged a number of experts, including members from the Computer Professionals Association of Nigeria, Chief External Examiners, who are heads of tertiary institutions, the Educational Assessment and Research Network in Africa, measurement experts, and Vice Chancellors from various institutions. If it is determined that there were indeed glitches, we will implement appropriate remedial measures promptly, as we do in the case of the examinations themselves.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
