

He said, "This is not just a statistics, it's a call to action. Adult education is no longer an afterthought or a remedial option; it is a strategic lifeline that empowers individuals."

PUNCH, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2025: <u>UI Emerges Nigeria's Best Varsity for 2026:</u> University of Ibadan, Oyo State, has been ranked Nigeria's best university in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2026. The ranking, published on THE's website on Thursday, placed the Ibadan-based federal university between 801 and 1,000 globally and ahead of other leading Nigerian universities, a spot it last held in 2023.

THE surveyed 2,191 institutions from 115 countries and assessed them based on 18 performance indicators across five key areas: teaching, research environment, research quality, industry, and international outlook. UI came from fourth position in 2025 to emerge as Nigeria's best in the 2026 ranking. It dethroned Covenant University, which was the best university in 2024 and 2025.

Following UI are the University of Lagos, Bayero University, and CU, ranked second, third, and fourth in Nigeria, respectively. Also in Businessday, Thursday, October 9, 2025

PUNCH, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2025: FG Gives Institutions 30 Days to Account for Unused TETFund Allocations: The Federal Government has given tertiary institutions 30 days to account for unspent Tertiary Education Trust Fund allocations, warning that idle money will be reallocated and officials will face sanctions for non-compliance.

The Minister of Education, Dr. Tunji Alausa, gave the directive in Abuja recently during a meeting with heads of institutions. Dr. Alausa noted that the ministry has faced a dilemma over allocations that are not being put to good use. He stated that resources for developing infrastructure have remained idle due

to bottlenecks.

The minister's directive follows repeated concerns from TETFund over the significant amount of unused allocations by higher institutions in Nigeria.

"Institutions must submit reconciled reports of all unutilised funds within 30 days, which will be jointly verified. Unused funds may be redirected to priority projects, and carrying them over without strong justification will no longer be allowed. Procurement plans must align with approved interventions, and approvals should be fast-tracked to prevent delays," Alausa said. "It reminds us that teachers are not just transmitters of knowledge, but the custodians of stability and the architects of change. Teachers have remained leaders and unsung heroes in our nation's history and ensure that our children are equipped to build a more hopeful future."

PUNCH, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2025: Ex-NUC Boss Hails UI, UNILAG Top Ranking on Times Varsities' List: The Chairman of the Nigerian Universities Ranking Advisory Committee and a former Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission, Professor Emeritus Peter Okebukola, has applauded the ranking of two Nigerian universities among the top 1000 in the 2026 World University Rankings by Times Higher Education released on Thursday.

Prof. Okebukola, in a statement on Thursday, said that the two top-ranked institutions are the University of Ibadan and the University of Lagos, with both having the same overall range score of 35.5–38.9.

"This is an improvement over the 2025 league tables, where only one Nigerian university- Covenant University was ranked among the top 1000 and the best in Nigeria", he stated.

Speaking during a sensitisation campaign in Lagos on Wednesday, the Head of the WAEC National Office, Dr. Amos Dangut, said every candidate who registers for the CB-WASSCE 2026 will be able to write the examination seamlessly...

Dr. Dangut explained that the sensitisation exercise was designed to prepare candidates and schools for the new system and to give them an opportunity to practise ahead of the examination.

According to him, "the Council is ready to place Nigeria among the comity of people that are promptly utilising technology..." he added.

...JAMB Registrar Restates Commitment to Staff Welfare, Vows to Give Justice to All

Prof. Oloyede disclosed that part of the package included the upward review of the existing retirement package in line with the commitment of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu to enhancing the welfare of retirees.

He also pointed out that arrangements have been made for those that would retire in the next five years to have their exit package deposited in their respective Retirement Savings Account not only to yield interest but also to pay such unfailingly to beneficiaries upon retirement.

He said arrangements have also

been made for those that have more than five years and above in the service of the Board towards providing them affordable housing in partnership with the Federal Housing Authority (FHA) thereby making them proud house owners on retirement.

He said the move is to allay anxiety as to where to retire to saying, "There is no need to fear anymore, the Board shall do everything within the law to providing affordable houses on retirement."

The Registrar also advised staff on rumour peddling, distortion, and misinformation while remind mischief makers that all would account for their acts before God.

"I will always give justice to whomever I come across irrespective of ethnic or religious affiliations. If you are a good person, I will relate with you and if you are bad, I will relate with you on that basis."

On promotion, he said the extant regulations of government is explicit on that as premium is placed on standard, merit and capacity noting that doing otherwise or giving undeserved promotion on the grounds of sympathy would be tantamount to destroying the system.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular.**

- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- 3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- 5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
- 7. Please be guided for compliance.





ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The Public Service recognizes the fact that organs of Government need to complement each other for the overall development of the nation. Thus, where particular expertise and/or experience is required and organs of Government cannot readily recruit, experienced staff from other organizations of Government are either **Seconded** or granted **Leave of Absence** to the institutions desiring such expertise to ensure the smooth running of Government machinery.

According to the Public Service Rules (**PSR 120234**), Leave of Absence is absence of an officer from authorized duty on grounds of Public Policy. All such leaves must be approved by the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation, on the recommendation of the Permanent Secretary/Head of Extra-Ministerial office and shall be without pay.

Who is eligible?

Leave of Absence is available to all serving officers of the Board. Eligibility is however determined by the type of Leave of Absence requested.

Types of Leave of Absence

The various types of Leave of Absence are:

- Leave of Absence to Join Spouse on course of instruction of not less than 9 months duration abroad;
- II. Special Leave of Absence to join spouse on grounds of public policy;
- III. Leave of Absence on grounds of public policy for Technical Aid Programmes;
- IV. Leave of Absence for Special/Personal Assistant on grounds of public policy; and
- Leave of Absence for spouse of Presidents, Vice Presidents, Governors, Deputy Governors, on grounds of Public Policy.

Important Points to Note

- Leave of Absence does not cover appointments such as; Secretary to Government
 of the Federation, Ministers, Secretary to State Government, Commissioners, or
 any other Political Appointment. An Officer who accepts the offered appointment
 is deemed to have resigned from service from the date of his acceptance of the
 offer;
- · Leave of Absence is without pay;
- · Such leave is not to be regarded as break in service;
- Leave of Absence is for a duration:
 - Not exceeding five (5) years (four years in the first instance and subject to an extension of not more than one year) to enable the spouse of a serving officer join his spouse on posting abroad; and
 - Of the tenure of office of the Principals/spouses of the officers who have been granted Leave of Absence

Final Word

Leave of Absence offers a twofold advantage to the system as it affords both the releasing and the receiving organizations the opportunity to share knowledge, experience and expertise. Officers planning to embark on Leave of Absence are encouraged to acquaint themselves with the provisions of the Public Service Rules, 2021 especially **Rules** 120234 – 120242 and other extant rules.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

- 2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.
- 3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.
- 4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:
 - a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
 - b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
 - c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
 - d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
 - e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to "VIEW ONLY" all recommendations by the Head of a Mother-Institution.

5. All Universities serving as Mother-institutions, Polytechnics/Monotechnics, Colleges of Education and other institutes offering degrees in affiliation with universities are to be guided by this, please.

ANY ADMISSION PROCESSED OUTSIDE CAPS IS ILLEGAL - OGUN COORDINATOR
