At the 2025 Policy Meeting on Admissions held on 18th July, 2025, and chaired by the Honourable Minister of Education, Dr. Maruf Tunji Alausa, CON, critical resolutions were

referred to as Monsura Aliat Aduragbemi) whose account with JAMB was reportedly suspended.

It is an established fact that a court of law had ordered that status quo be maintained, which implies that nothing should be done either to the detriment or advantage of the candidate and/or the two (2) institutions (OAU and UNILAG).

Contrary to the misrepresentation in court, the status quo was that as at 25th of September 2025 when the suit was filed purportedly on her behalf and up till 30th of September 2025 when the order was given, the candidate, on her own volition, was no longer a candidate of any of OAU or UNILAG.

It is the fraudulent attempts to change into one of the two (2)

universities that JAMB did not allow in the spirit of the status quo.

In order to maintain the status quo, JAMB does not alter nor allow any alteration either by the candidate or any of the two institutions. The suspension message being mischievously misrepresented is a usual programmed default message that pops-up on any profile on which any alteration by the Board officials, institutions or candidate had been restricted.

Similarly, the two institutions are also not allowed to complete their admission lists in order not to alter the status quo. Attempt by any of the two institutions to complete its admission will generate a similar default message.

It was when the fraudulent effort to tamper with the status quo became unsuccessful that those sponsoring her apparently became frustrated and have since resorted to media blackmail in a bid to pressurize the Board into violating the court order.

The Board wishes to make it categorically clear that it will neither alter nor allow any alteration to be carried out on the concerned profiles by any of the other parties on its platform in conformity with the court order.

As a law-abiding government agency, JAMB remains fully committed to upholding the rule of law and complying strictly with judicial directives. The Board will not be drawn into any media-driven drama designed to undermine the integrity of the judicial process.

We therefore urge all parties, including the conflict entrepreneurs to respect the authority of the courts, desist from spreading falsehoods, and refrain from using impressionable candidates as tools for self-promotion and mischief.

The Board reiterates its unwavering commitment to fairness, transparency, and due process in all its operations.

qualified candidates, who selected them as their first choice to the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) on or before Tuesday, 30th September, 2025.

Private universities, on the other hand, are required to submit their admission recommendations on or before Friday, 31st October, 2025, to allow sufficient time for other tiers of tertiary institutions to conduct their admissions.

It was further agreed that the 2025 admission exercise would close as follows:

Public Universities: 31st October, 2025;

Private Universities: 30th November, 2025; and

Other Tertiary Institutions (Polytechnics, Colleges of Education, etc.): 31st December, 2025.

These timelines were designed to ensure a structured and predictable academic calendar across all institutions and to allow every tier of

tertiary education to conduct its admission process seamlessly.

However, records available on the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS), the platform through which all admissions are conducted, revealed that some institutions have yet to submit a single admission recommendation to the Board, despite the clear directives and ample time provided.

It is particularly concerning that certain public universities have not made any submissions, even after the September deadline had elapsed. The policy meeting had expressly directed that, even where institutions were not ready to resume academic exercises, they should at least process and archive their admissions to ensure compliance with the approved schedule.

Consequently, the following institutions are hereby requested to commence their 2025 admissions immediately:

Northwest University, Kano, Kano

State;

Nigeria Police Academy, Wudil, Kano State;

Kano State University of Science and Technology, Wudil, Kano State;

Benue State University, Makurdi, Benue State;

Abdulkadir Kure University, Minna, Niger State;

Nigerian Defence Academy, Kaduna, Kaduna State;

Emmanuel Alayande University of Education, Oyo, Oyo State; and

Federal University of Medical and Health Sciences, Funtua, Katsina State.

The Board strongly urges these universities to commence their 2025 admission processes without further delay.

Failure to act within the approved timelines will result in all unprocessed candidates being moved automatically to the next available tier of institutions for possible consideration.

PREMIUM TIMES, TUESDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2025: Mathematics No Longer Compulsory for Arts Students as FG Reviews Institutions' Entry Requirements: Candidates seeking admissions into Faculties of Arts in

Nigerian Universities no longer need to pass Mathematics in their Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE), according to a revised National Guidelines for Entry Requirements into Nigerian Tertiary Institutions. However, a credit in the English Language remains a requirement, the statement said.

LEADERSHIP, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2025: Why We Excluded Underage UTME Candidate, Who Scored 371, From Final Vetting – JAMB: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has provided clarification on the exclusion of Kareem Kaamilah Omolarami, an underage candidate who scored 371 in the 2025 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), from the final vetting process for minors.

Out of 41,027 underage candidates who sat the UTME under this category, only 176 were confirmed eligible to proceed to a final assessment, which comprised a written test and a face-to-face interview. The multi-stage screening for these candidates took place on October 8 and 9, following an initial screening scheduled between September 22 and 26. JAMB stated that Omolarami, who applied to Nile University, successfully completed the first two of the four-stage vetting process.

However, she was reported absent for the university's internal screening, which forms the third stage. Consequently, she was not invited to participate in the final vetting conducted by a JAMB panel.

The board explained that the four-stage vetting process requires candidates to first achieve a minimum UTME score of 320, then score at least 80 per cent in their Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE), and

subsequently meet the university's internal screening threshold of 80 per cent. The final stage involves a JAMB-administered screening, again requiring a minimum score of 80 per cent. Candidates may only advance to each subsequent stage after fulfilling the criteria of the previous one.

"This report was formally transmitted to the board by the institution, thereby rendering her ineligible to participate in the final screening exercise," JAMB said. "Her non-invitation to the final stage was therefore not due to any administrative oversight, bias, or procedural lapse on the part of the board."

JAMB confirmed that the results of 84 successful underage candidates are currently being processed and will soon be forwarded to their respective institutions for the finalisation of admissions.

PUNCH, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2025: Computer-based WASSCE Will Curb Exam Malpractice, WAEC Insists: The West African Examinations Council has disclosed plans to commence computer-based examinations, tagged CB-WASSCE, saying it will help curb examination malpractices. The new system, which will combine both digital and manual features scheduled to take off next year with the current SS3 students across the country, and will also improve the integrity of its assessments.

Speaking during a sensitisation rally in Port Harcourt to educate stakeholders, students, and the public on the innovation, the Zonal Coordinator of WAEC, Port Harcourt Office, Mr. Adeniran Amusan, said the digitalisation initiative aims to eliminate examination leakages, ensure the timely conduct of exams, and enhance efficiency. He said, "The CB-WASSCE will eradicate the problem of logistics and late arrival of papers. The computer will also time the students, thereby ensuring fairness and transparency.

"It's a hybrid system, the objective questions will be done on the

"The essence is that students will not be subcharged, it is faster, there won't be issues of logistics of late arrival of papers." Amusan explained that the move aligns with global best practices and will prepare students for technology-driven assessments in the future. He urged schools, teachers, parents, and students to embrace the new system as part of the modernisation of education in Nigeria.

The suspension was announced in a letter signed by the Registrar and Secretary of Council, Evans Iyanya, with reference number FCE/OB/REG/CT-A/Vol.II/273, titled "LETTER OF SUSPENSION AND GENERAL INEFFICIENCY."...

The letter read in part, "The 8th Governing Council is in receipt of allegations and series of complaints against you from Deans of Schools, the three Unions in the College; Colleges of Education Academic Staff Union (COEASU), Senior Staff Union in Colleges Of Education Nigeria (SSUCOEN), Non Academic Staff Union (NASU) and Director of Procurement for surreptitiously auctioning of college unserviceable cars and other irregularities vehicles. This is in violation of the White Paper of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the report of the visiting panel into the affairs of the College 2011–2015."

Consequently, the Council, at its 5th Regular Meeting, directed that Prof. Utubaku proceed on a three-month suspension effective from October 14, 2025, pending the conclusion of an investigation into the allegations.

LEADERSHIP, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 17, 2025: Kano Varsity Expels 34 Students Over Examination Malpractice: The Aliko Dangote University of Science and Technology (ADUST), Wudil, owned by the Kano State government, has expelled 34 students over their involvement in examination misconduct.

In a statement issued on Friday by the Head of Information, Publications and Public Relations Unit, Mr. Abdullahi Datti, the university said the decision was approved by the University Senate at its 123rd meeting held on October 9, 2025.

According to the statement, the Senate acted upon the report of the Examinations Regulations and Irregularities Committee, which recommended varying sanctions for students found guilty of violating examination rules.

"Thirty-four students were expelled, while 13 others were rusticated for one academic session. Several others received warning letters, depending on the severity of their offences," the statement read.

unwavering commitment to transparency, fairness, and strict adherence to due process in all its admission activities. It is important to note that the Central Admission Processing System (CAPS) was introduced to standardise and automate the admission process across all tertiary institutions in Nigeria. This innovation was specifically designed to eliminate human interference and ensure that all candidates are treated equitably, based solely on merit and established criteria.

Under this system, all admissions must be processed exclusively through CAPS, and every candidate's claim and credential must be duly uploaded, verified, and validated before consideration.

For underage candidates, the Board established a rigorous four-stage screening process to identify and reward exceptional academic performance while upholding the integrity of the admission system. The stages are as follows:

1. Attaining a minimum score of 320 in the UTME;
2. Scoring at least 80% in the Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE);
3. Achieving 80% in the university's

internal screening exercise; and

4. Undergoing a final screening conducted by a JAMB-appointed panel comprising Vice-Chancellors, civil society representatives, education experts, and other distinguished professionals, during which the candidate must also score not less than 80%.

A candidate becomes eligible for the next stage only after successfully meeting the requirements of the preceding one.

In the case of Miss Kareem Kaamilah Omolarami, while she successfully scaled through the first two stages, she was officially reported absent by the Nile University of Nigeria during the third stage, the university's internal screening exercise. This report was formally transmitted to the Board by the institution, thereby rendering her ineligible to participate in the final screening exercise, which took place on Wednesday, 8th and 9th October 2025.

Her non-invitation to the final stage was therefore not due to any administrative oversight, bias, or procedural lapse on the part of the Board, but rather a direct consequence of the university's official report confirming her absence during its screening

exercise.

It is pertinent to note that Miss Kareem Kaamilah Omolarami, on Tuesday, 7th October 2025, raised a formal complaint (ticket) through the Board's support platform, petitioning Nile University regarding her exclusion. In response, the Board has requested an official explanation from the university and is currently awaiting its report to enable a fair and evidence-based review of the matter.

The Board reiterates that, while it is statutorily empowered to regulate and approve admissions into all tertiary institutions in Nigeria, the respective universities are responsible for recommending suitably qualified candidates based on their internal selection process that meets established outcomes. Accordingly, JAMB's actions are guided strictly by the verified information submitted by each institutions.

In full recognition of institutional autonomy, the Board will proceed to release the results of the 84 successful underage candidates currently being processed to their respective institutions of choice, to enable the finalisation of their admissions.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
7. Please be guided for compliance.

In Nigeria's Public Service, this conversation has long been settled through a clearly defined Dress Code. More than a matter of fashion, the dress code promotes discipline, decorum, and the projection of a positive image of the Service. JAMB, therefore cannot be an exception.

Every Staff — regardless of rank, role, or location — is expected to dress professionally, modestly, and decently, reflecting the dignity and responsibility of our office.

For Men: try any of;

- Collared shirts and neatly tucked-in trousers (preferably with a tie);
- Formal suits or jackets with collared shirts and trousers;
- Traditional attire, worn complete with caps.

For Women: try any of;

- Blouses with skirts or trousers (preferably tucked in);
- Formal suits or jackets with blouses and skirts/trousers;
- Traditional gowns or wrappers, complemented with appropriate headgear.

Important Guidelines to Note

To maintain professionalism, the following are *inappropriate* in our office:

- Transparent or revealing clothing;
- Mini-skirts, leggings, sandals, or ostentatious jewelry;
- Gauzy, net-like shirts, sando, strapless or spaghetti-strap blouses;
- Jeans, joggers, or sportswear (except on designated days);
- Any other form of inappropriate or immodest attire.

Recognized Exceptions:

- Religious or Cultural Attire: May be worn in line with Board's guidelines.
- Health or Disability Considerations: Reasonable adjustments are allowed.
- Fieldwork or Special Events: Alternative attire may be approved for practicality or cultural relevance, like what we practiced on Thursdays

A Final Word

Violating the official dress code constitutes misconduct under *Public Service Rules (2021) 100313*. Misconduct, is defined as any improper behaviour that tarnishes the image of the Board, can attract sanctions — including termination or retirement — upon investigation and proof.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.

3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.

4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:

- a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
- b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
- c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
- d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
- e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: *The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to “VIEW ONLY” all recommendations by the Head of a Mother-Institution.*

5. All Universities serving as Mother-institutions, Polytechnics/Monotechnics, Colleges of Education and other institutes offering degrees in affiliation with universities are to be guided by this, please.

JAMB NOT LIABLE FOR DELAYS IN THE PROCESSING OF INDEMNITY FORMS – OSUN STATE COORDINATOR

The Osun State Coordinator of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Mr. Babatunde Jacob, has debunked the widespread notion that the Board is responsible for the delays experienced by many candidates in the processing of their indemnity forms.

This was part of his explanations when he played host to a delegation from the South-West Chapter of the National Association of Nigerian Students (NANS), which visited the State Office on Tuesday, 7th October, 2025.

While speaking on their motive for the visit, the Director of Campus Affairs, NANS South-West Zone, Comr. Abiola Tayo Oyetunmbi, revealed that they were in the State Office to seek clarification on the processing of candidates' indemnity forms, based on some complaints received from their members about the undue delays in the processing of their applications.

Oyetunmbi noted that many institutions were in the habit of sending their members back to JAMB

whenever they visit to follow up on their applications.

In his remarks, the State Coordinator, Mr. Babatunde Jacob, expressed appreciation to the students' representatives for coming, while shedding light on the grey areas.

According to the Coordinator, as of the time of their visit, there was no pending indemnity form on his table to be processed, noting that all the applications earlier received had been processed accordingly.

He also utilised the occasion to explain the procedures involved in the processing of indemnity forms as part of the process of condoning illegal admissions already done.

"When candidates apply for a Programme Change for instance, they will be given an indemnity form to be submitted at their various institutions; the school in turn, will compile the forms and attest to offering the candidates the admissions, then, return them to the respective JAMB State Offices for onward processing to the National Headquarters, where final approval or disapproval is granted.

"At the point of uploading the indemnity forms at the State Offices, if it is discovered that the institution did not authorize the forms, such forms will be rejected and it is the duty of the affected school to pick up these rejected forms. In the same vein, if the application is not accompanied by the requisite supporting documents, it will be rejected.

"As such, the delay is either caused by the candidates themselves or the institutions, hence JAMB is not liable for the delays being experienced," he said.

In his remarks, Mr. Issa Burhanudeen admonished candidates to seek admissions through appropriate channels to avoid unnecessary embarrassments, stressing that any admission got outside the JAMB Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) is null and void.

Other notable NANS figure at the interactive session were the Senior Adviser, Publicity, NANS South-West Zone, Ibraheem Oladele Aremu.

LEAD BY EXAMPLE – ADEBIYI ADMONISHES JAMB GOMBE OFFICE

A call has gone to all Heads of Units of the Gombe State Office, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), to imbibe leadership by example for effective service delivery.

This admonition was part of the issues discussed during an interactive session with these Unit Heads of the State Office on Tuesday, 7th October, 2025.

All the institutions visited expressed appreciation to the Board for the advocacy visit and promised to abide by all extant advisories issued by the Board.
