JAMB CONDUCTS PROMOTION EXAMINATION FOR OVER 600 STAFF



The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) successfully conducted its 2026 promotion examination for staff on Friday, June 27, 2025.

The examination was carried out using a Computer-Based Testing (CBT) format, featuring questions similar in format to

Matriculation Examination (UTME). The test items covered various subjects, including English Language, Public Service Rule, JAMB-related processes, and other relevant topics.

JAMB REGISTRAR RECEIVES REPORT OF FACT FINDING COMMITTEE ON PROCESSING OF 2025 UTME RESULTS

The Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has received the report of the fact-finding committee on the processing of 2025 UTME results.

The committee, which submitted its report on 25th June, 2025, was inaugurated on 20th May, 2025, and was chaired by the erudite scholar and Professor of software engineering, Prof. Bashir Galadanci.

The fact-finding committee was

mandated to investigate thoroughly the causes of the erroneous processing of some of the UTME 2025 results; analyse the handling of the incident by the ITS Department and its external service providers and review the process by which the resit examination was conducted and confirm that all affected candidates were accommodated among other recommendations.

The Registrar, while receiving the report, thanked the chairman and members of

2025 MOP-UP UTME: FEAR OF ARREST BY EXAMINATION CHEATS, IMPERSONATORS BEHIND LOW TURNOUT

The low turnout of candidates for the 2025 Mop-Up examination conducted over the weekend by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) nationwide has been attributed to the series of stringent security measures targeting impersonators and examination cheats across the country.

The Registrar of the Board, Prof. Is-haq

Oloyede, disclosed this while fielding questions from newsmen shortly after monitoring the examination at Technology CBT Centre, NAF Valley Estate, Abuja, on Saturday, 28th June, 2025.

Prof. Oloyede noted that mop-up examinations are usually organised by the Board for a few thousand candidates at most, who on account of legitimate

FRAUDSTERS USING AI TO BLEND FACES OF ALBINOS FOR EXAMINATION MALPRACTICE – OLOYEDE



The Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has raised the alarm at the rate at which fraudsters manipulate technology to perpetuate examination malpractice.

He disclosed that the recent discoveries involved the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) to blend faces of two candidates and make the resulting picture look like that of an Albino in a bid to exploit facial recognition vulnerabilities.

"Some individuals attempted to

cheat by falsely declaring themselves as albino in a bid to exploit facial recognition vulnerabilities.

"They are not albinos. It is because the AI that they were using had certain features such that if they do not declare themselves as albino on our forms, you will look critically more."

He pointed out that the confessions of those arrested gave insight into this high tech fraud.

"We have never had even up to 100 albinos any year. But this year, we have 1,787 albinos. Those who

declared themselves as albino, therefore, totaled 1,787.

"So, out of 2 million candidates that registered in centres across the country, we found out that one centre alone had registered 450 out of this figure as if all albinos in Africa decided to go to that particular centre. So, when one of those arrested gave us information that, look, I will tell you what really happened and he did.

"So, we went after all those who claimed to be albinos only to find out that all the genuine albinos who registered for the 2025 UTME are less than 250.

"You could all see the dark-complexion man arrested in Benin City claiming to be an albino. How do you become albino? But that is one of their strategies. To declare that they are albino because what they do in blending is that if you want to impersonate someone, they will take the picture of the two of you together and then blend it. When you look at the picture, It will also look like you. That's what AI is doing now. It's picture blending," he said.

He pointed out that the report would go a long way towards improving the quality of service being

delivered to the Nigeria people.

He said, "the initiative to set up the committee is to put on record what had happened so that such incident would not recur in future."

Prof. Oloyede said the report would

be tabled before the management of the Board with a view to acting on its recommendations without delay.

VANGUARD, SUNDAY, JUNE 22, 2025: 3 Nigerian Universities Make World Ranking-: Only three Nigerian universities have made it to the 2026 QS World University Rankings released on Thursday by global higher education analyst, Quacquarelli Symonds (QS)—and none of them placed in the top 1,000. The institutions listed were the University of Ibadan (UI), University of Lagos (UNILAG), and Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria. UI and UNILAG were both placed in the 1001–1200 band, the same range they occupied in the 2025 edition. ABU, which had no previous ranking in 2025, was ranked in the 1201–1400 category for 2026.

QS is known for provision of data and insights on global higher education, it evaluates universities based on factors including academic and employer reputation, faculty-to-student ratio, research citations, international student diversity, global research networks, employment outcomes, and sustainability efforts...

NATION, SUNDAY, JUNE 22, 2025: ABUAD Makes History, Ranks 84th Best University Globally-: Afe Babalola University, Ado-Ekiti (ABUAD), has achieved a major milestone, securing the 84th position globally and 3rd in Africa in the latest

Times Higher Education (THE) World University Impact Rankings.

The institution also topped several categories across the continent, emerging 1st in Africa for SDG 7 (Affordable & Clean Energy) and SDG 13 (Climate Action), 2nd for SDG 1 (No Poverty), and 3rd for SDG 17 (Partnership for the Goals).

Nationally, ABUAD maintained its position as Nigeria's number one university for four consecutive years—2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025—while leading the country in all four SDG categories mentioned...

PUNCH, TUESDAY, JUNE 24, 2025: FG Lists Requirements For New Ekiti Varsity Take-Off-: An assessment team from the Federal Ministry of Education and the National Universities Commission has outlined key facilities needed to ensure the smooth take-off of the newly established Federal University of Technology and Environmental Sciences, Iyin-Ekiti.

President Bola Tinubu had in February signed the bill establishing the university into law, with its management setting September for the commencement of admissions. During an inspection visit recently, the assessment team listed additional needs for the take-off phase, including a well-equipped library, official vehicles for four

principal officers, 10 directors, the Pro-Chancellor, and four deans.

Leader of the delegation, Mrs Rakiya Gambo-Ilyasu, who spoke in Iyin-Ekiti, said the team also found that some key facilities were already in place at both the temporary and permanent sites of the institution. These include an ICT building, central laboratory, chemistry and physics laboratories, classrooms, clinic, library, boreholes, hostels, and a 500-seater auditorium...

CHANNELSTV, THURSDAY, JUNE 26, 2025: Makinde Renames The Polytechnic Ibadan After Olunloyo-: As former Oyo Governor, Victor Olunloyo, is laid to rest, the Oyo State Governor, Mr. Seyi Makinde, has renamed The Polytechnic, Ibadan, as Omololu Olunloyo Polytechnic, Ibadan, to immortalize the late scholar.

Olunloyo, who died on April 6, 2025, was the pioneer principal of the polytechnic, while he also served as Governor of Oyo State between October 1 and December 31, 1983. The Governor announced this on Thursday at the state interdenominational funeral service held in honour of the late former governor at the Obafemi Awolowo Stadium, Liberty Road, Ibadan.

PUNCH, FRIDAY, JUNE 27, 2025: JAMB Laments Low Turnout Of Candidates Printing Mop-Up Exam Slips-: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board has expressed concern over the low turnout of candidates reprinting their notification slips for the upcoming make-up Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination. In a statement issued by its spokesperson, Dr. Fabian Benjamin, the Board revealed that only a small fraction of the scheduled candidates had completed the slip-printing process.

"As of this morning (Friday), only 12,442 out of the 98,232 scheduled candidates have printed their slips, reflecting a mere 12.6% participation rate," the statement read. To this end, JAMB appealed to affected candidates, particularly those who missed their main UTME, to take immediate action in order not to miss the rare opportunity.

"We strongly encourage all candidates, particularly those who missed the main examination, to print their notification slips promptly. "This is a rare opportunity for them to participate in this year's examination," the Board said.

PUNCH, FRIDAY, JUNE 27, 2025: NElfund to Fund Vocational Training for Tradesmen, Apprentices-: The Nigerian Education Loan Fund said it will partner with Yaba College of Technology to expand access to Technical and Vocational Education and Training, especially for apprentices and tradesmen in the informal sector.

The partnership was cemented during a high-level stakeholder engagement held at YABATECH on

Thursday, where NElfund Managing Director/CEO, Mr Akintunde Sawyerr, visited the institution to discuss the student loan rollout and explore new inclusion models for non-traditional learners.

Speaking at the event, Mr. Sawyerr emphasised NElfund's commitment to ensuring that financial support reaches every Nigerian learner, including those pursuing vocational and technical education through informal or non-traditional pathways.

"What YABATECH is doing with its Workplace Learning Centres is exactly the type of model we want to support. If apprentices in places like Computer Village are given structured, certifiable training, NElfund can provide them with the financial backing to complete that training," Sawyerr said.

PUNCH, FRIDAY, JUNE 27, 2025: 15 Education Colleges To Award Degrees, NCE Concurrently-: The Federal Government has officially commenced the concurrent implementation of bachelor's degree programmes across 15 approved Federal Colleges of Education in Nigeria.

This move follows President Bola

Tinubu's recent assent to the legislation empowering Federal Colleges of Education to award both the Nigeria Certificate in Education and Bachelor's degrees in education.

Speaking at a one-day sensitisation programme on ministerial deliverables and the education sector roadmap, the Permanent Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Education, Mr. Abel Enitan, announced the development.

Mr. Enitan, represented by the Director of Educational Planning, Mrs. Julie Uzor, noted that the dual certification model was aimed at revitalising teacher education and addressing dwindling enrollment.

"This policy allows colleges of education to concurrently award the NCE and Bachelor's degrees in Education. As outlined in the Federal Colleges of Education Act, 2023, this dual mode enhances access, improves quality, and modernizes teacher training," he said... PUNCH, MONDAY, JUNE 23, 2025: Kogi Poly Expels Six, Withdraws 273 Students For Exam Malpractice, Others--: The Academic Board of Kogi State Polytechnic, Lokoja has withdrawn 273 students while another six students were expelled over examination malpractices.

These decisions were taken when the board considered and approved the First Semester results for the 2024/2025 Academic Session.

The Polytechnic Director of Public Relations and Protocol, Uredo Omale, in a statement on Monday, stated that this was part of the far-reaching decisions at the 120th meeting of the board held on Thursday 17th April, at the Polytechnic Main Campus, Lokoja.

"The Chairman of the Board, Professor Salisu Ogbo Usman, commended members of the Academic Board Result Verification Committee led by the Deputy Rector, Dr. Samuel Taiwo Olowo, for the due diligence on the results and charged them to sustain the tempo," Omale said.

reasons, such as verified technical issues.

"Given the work that we have done in conjunction with the DSS, the NSCDC and the police. We have been able to get some actionable intelligence, that we could use to apprehend impersonators. So, we felt that it's better to keep the door open as wide as possible. At least to apprehend impersonators."

The Registrar pointed out that about 12,000 plus candidates had indicated interest in sitting the examination as garnered through the number of reprinted examination slips on the eve of the mop-up out of the over 90,000 slated to take the examination.

He explained that the large number of candidates sitting the 2025 mop-up was occasioned by the various reports of widespread absence in the main examination, prompting the Board to give everyone a second chance especially against the backdrop of sound intelligence gathered from security agencies.

"Therefore, in the wisdom of the management and our stakeholders, we felt everybody, who missed the exam, should be given another opportunity regardless of the

reasons for missing the exam in the first instance.

"However, owing to the fear of arrest by these candidates, some CBT centres expecting 250 candidates per session recorded fewer than 20 attendees!

"Because what you have is a bunch of fraudulent individuals parading themselves as tutorial centres along with some private school proprietors who have constituted themselves into syndicates for examination malpractice," he stated.

He commended the determination of the Hon. Minister of Education, Dr. Maruf Tunji Alausa, to confront the menace of examination malpractice headlong saying that the

determination of the Minister to lead this war would no doubt reduce to the barest minimum the huge number of examination malpractice cases recorded in the country.

The Registrar emphasized that suspected impersonators, who failed to take the exam after alleging exclusion from the main UTME, would not escape accountability.

"They registered with their name. They have schools. They have their respective NINs and we also have their phone numbers. All these would enable security agencies to pick them up easily. And indeed, quite a number of them have already been picked up," he said.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
