NATION, MONDAY, APRIL 20, 2026: Nigeria–Niger Commission Receives Verified List Of Accredited Institutions From Niger: The Nigeria–Niger Joint Commission (NNJC) has received an official list of fully accredited private universities and higher institutions in the Niger Republic, in a move aimed at strengthening academic verification and cross-border education standards.

The list was approved by Niger's Minister of Education and Scientific Research, Mamadou Saidou, who directed its transmission to the Secretary General of the Commission, Musa S. Mamman, during a formal meeting at his office.

PEOPLES GAZETTE, MONDAY, APRIL 20, 2026: JAMB Conducts UTME For 135 Visually Impaired Candidates In Kano: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has commenced the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) for 135 candidates with special needs in the Kano centre. The examination, organised by JAMB's Equal Opportunity Group (JEOG), is being conducted simultaneously in 11 specialised centres nationwide. At the Kano centre, held at Bayero University, Kano, School of Continuing Education, 135 candidates from Kano and

neighbouring states participated, making it the centre with the highest turnout this year.

JEOG Kano Coordinator, Yahuza Bello, described the programme as "another landmark in inclusive education. "About 530 candidates with special needs are sitting the UTME nationwide under conditions adapted to their requirements," he said.

PEOPLES GAZETTE, TUESDAY, APRIL 21, 2026: JAMB Withholds Underage UTME Candidates' Results: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) says that candidates currently seeing "No Result Yet" when checking their Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) results are underage applicants whose results have not yet been released. This is contained in a statement issued by the JAMB's Public Communication Advisor, Dr Fabian Benjamin, on Tuesday in Abuja.

According to Dr Benjamin, the message does not indicate a technical error, but reflects the status of candidates who do not yet meet the eligibility requirements for admission. He said only candidates who would be at least 16 years old by Sept. 30, 2026, were eligible to register for and sit the UTME, except in special cases.

Dr Benjamin said underage

candidates may only be considered under an exceptional category if they demonstrate outstanding academic ability. This, he said, included scoring 320 and above in the UTME and attaining at least 80 per cent in subsequent screening exercises.

He added that the arrangement was reached and endorsed by the parents of the affected candidates.

PEOPLES GAZETTE, TUESDAY, APRIL 21, 2026: FG, NEDC train 100 Adamawa Teachers In Digital Literacy: The Office of the Vice President, in partnership with the North-East Development Commission, has trained about 100 teachers in digital literacy to strengthen education delivery in Adamawa State. The Senior Special Assistant to the President on Regional Development Programmes, Mrs. Mariam Masha, made the disclosure during a presentation at the Academic Support and Skills Enhancement Programme on Tuesday in Yola.

She said the in-person training targeted science, technology, mathematics and agriculture teachers in senior secondary schools across the North-East, covering Gombe, Bauchi, Borno, Yobe, Adamawa and Taraba states.

UBEC: 8.7m Pupils Benefit From Improved Learning Conditions Nationwide: The Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) has announced that approximately 8.7 million learners across Nigeria have so far benefitted from enhanced learning environments and improved instructional materials under ongoing reforms in the basic education sector.

The Executive Secretary of UBEC, Dr. Aisha Garba, made this known at the opening of the 29th Quarterly Meeting of UBEC Management with Executive Chairmen of State Universal Basic Education Boards (SUBEBs). The meeting, themed: "Accelerating Basic Education Performance

Through Digitally Enabled Coordination", brought together key stakeholders to review progress and strengthen collaboration in the implementation of basic education policies nationwide.

FG: N30bn Disbursed Directly To Students Through TVET Initiative: The Minister of Education, Dr. Tunji Alausa, on Thursday, has revealed to students at the University of Abuja that under the Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) initiative, over N30 billion has been disbursed directly to students nationwide.

Beyond vocational training, the Minister outlined new entrepreneurship programmes embedded in tertiary institutions, including innovation hubs, venture capital grants for students, and incubation schemes designed to help young Nigerians transform ideas into viable businesses. He made the appeal while serving as a panelist at the Renewed Hope Conversations – University of Abuja Edition, held at the institution's main campus, now renamed Yakubu Gowon University.

He disclosed that emerging fields such as artificial intelligence and data science have now been integrated into learning at multiple levels.

He said, "On education, let me be clear: we are reforming the system to ensure relevance and impact. Students are encouraged to pursue courses that are aligned with market needs. Some programmes that do not provide practical value will be phased out. Education must equip you for the real world. "The world is changing rapidly, and Nigeria must not be left behind. Skills development is central to our strategy."

Tinubu Makes New Board, Management Appointments for NECO, NBTE, Federal Poly, Shendam, National Library: President Bola Tinubu has made new appointments for the National Examination Council (NECO), National Board of Technical

Education (NBTE), Federal Polytechnic in N'yak Shendam, Plateau State, and National Library of Nigeria, all institutions under the Federal Ministry of Education.

According to a statement issued by his Adviser on Information and Strategy, Mr. Bayo Onanuga, the President appointed Prof Modupe Adeola Adelabu as Chairman of Governing Board of NECO, and retained the current Registrar, Prof Ibrahim Dantani Wushishi. He also appointed Dr. Bongfa Binfa as Rector, Federal Polytechnic, N'yak-Shendam, Plateau State; and renewed the tenure of Prof Chinwe Veronica Anunobi as Director/Chief Executive of the National Library of Nigeria. For the chairmanship of NBTE, the president appointed Prof Babatunde Salako.

FUTA secures MDCN accreditation for health sciences, advances teaching hospital plan: The Federal University of Technology, Akure (FUTA) in Ondo State has recorded a major milestone in its push to establish a teaching hospital, following full accreditation of its School of Health Sciences by the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN). The accreditation, granted after an assessment visit by an MDCN team led by Deputy Registrar Nnameka Nwakanma on 22 April, clears the way for the university's College of Medicine to gain global visibility.

With the approval, the college will be listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools, opening international pathways for its graduates. The council also approved an annual admission quota of 100 students for the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) programme.

NAIJANEWS.COM, THURSDAY, APRIL 23, 2026: Fake JAMB Official Arrested In Anambra: Operatives of the Inspector General of Police Safe School Initiative in the Anambra State Police Command have arrested a man identified as Mr. Eric Nwombu for alleged impersonation and unlawful possession of JAMB examination documents. This was made known in Awka through a statement from the Police Public Relations Officer, SP Tochukwu Ikenga.

According to the statement, officers recovered eight JAMB examination slips from the suspect, along with an exercise book containing names and examination numbers of students. He was also unable to give a clear account of how he got the materials.

The suspect was said to have been picked up after a report from a cyber cafe in Atani, where he had been collecting 2026 JAMB examination slips from students who came to check their examination centres.

He was reported to have told people at the centre that he was a JAMB 2026 coordinator in Atani. However, workers at the cyber cafe became suspicious of his actions and alerted the police. When officers arrived, the suspect tried to run but was caught.

The Commissioner of Police in Anambra State, CP Ikiye Orutugu, restated the command's commitment to protecting the credibility of public examinations. The establishment of the JAMB Capacity Development and Training School (JCDTS) followed the meeting of its Conceptual Committee held on 30th September, 2025, and its subsequent visits to the Kaduna Zonal Office to assess the readiness of the facility for operation.

The proposed training school represents a strategic investment in capacity building, systems testing, and operational excellence across all four cycles of the Board's operations as follows: Accreditation, Applications, Examinations and Admissions.

The establishment of the JAMB Capacity Development and Training School, Kaduna, further represents a transformative investment in Nigeria's educational infrastructure. By creating a world-class facility dedicated to capacity building across all dimensions of its operations, JAMB has positioned itself not only as an examination body but also as a catalyst for excellence in educational assessment and management.

According to the Registrar, the Kaduna facility is designed to provide a strong foundation for this

initiative, supported by existing infrastructure, reliable utilities in a strategic and serene location.

It would be recalled that the facility's Conceptual Committee, chaired by Dr. Foluke Aliyu, with Mr. Damilola Bamiro serving as Secretary, and comprising key stakeholders of the Board, had conducted a comprehensive inspection tour of the facility prior to its commissioning.

Additional resource persons on the committee included representatives from Public Affairs & Protocols, Technical Staff, and members of the facility's management team.

The vision behind this noble idea is to establish a premier training facility that will serve as a hub for capacity building, systems testing, and technological innovation for all aspects of the Board's operations.

By establishing the training facility, the Board reaffirmed its commitment to birthing a seamless data ecosystem that supports effective decision-making, improve operational efficiency, checkmate the activities of increasingly sophisticated criminal elements determined to exploiting system vulnerabilities, as well as bridge critical training gaps.

The establishment of a dedicated Capacity Development and Training School is, therefore, essential to

addressing these gaps, while positioning JAMB as a centre of excellence in examination administration and educational technology.

On strategic positioning and future expansion, the Kaduna facility will serve as the flagship training centre, with long-term plans for expansion across Nigeria's geopolitical zones. This training facility is also designed to facilitate

Regional training programmes, reduce travel costs and logistical challenges, act as a server collection centre during examination periods, provide hands-on training for technical officers prior to field deployment, provide partnership opportunities with international examination bodies for capacity building, foster research and development initiatives in examination technology and ultimately establishing JAMB as a knowledge hub capable of sharing its expertise with other African nations and international examination bodies.

Meanwhile, Mr. Olukayode Dada, Deputy Director, Human Resource Management Department, has been appointed as the pioneer Director of the training school.

and endorsed by parents of these underage candidates, only those who score 320 and above will be shortlisted and invited to proceed to the next stages of the screening. Successful candidates at that stage may then be considered for admission under the exceptional candidates provision.

For now, results for underage candidates remain unreleased.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
7. Please be guided for compliance.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.

3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.

4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:

- a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
- b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
- c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
- d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
- e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: *The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to “VIEW ONLY” all recommendations by the Head of a Mother-Institution.*

5. All Universities serving as Mother-institutions, Polytechnics/Monotechnics, Colleges of Education and other institutes offering degrees in affiliation with universities are to be guided by this, please.

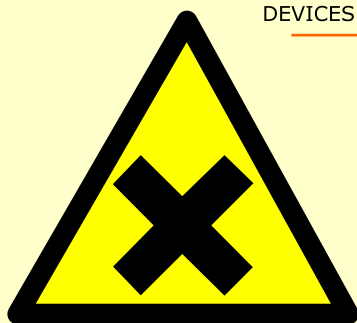

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has reaffirmed its stance against examination malpractice by restating the ban on certain items during the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME). These items as identified by the Board, are prohibited from examination venues due to their potential to aid in malpractice. Some of these prohibited items are but not limited to:

13 SMART LENSES



14 SMART RINGS/ JEWELLERY



15 OTHER SIMILAR DEVICES

The prohibition of these items is aimed at safeguarding the integrity of the UTME and preventing examination malpractice.

Over the years, these items have been noted to facilitate cheating among candidates and their collaborators. By banning them, JAMB intends to uphold the sanctity of its examinations and ensure fairness for all candidates.

The Board has reiterated its commitment to zero tolerance for examination malpractice. Any candidate or official found in possession of any of these prohibited items will face appropriate sanctions, which may include disqualification from the examination or legal action. These measures are intended to serve as a deterrent to potential offenders and maintain the credibility of the UTME results.

The restatement of the ban on prohibited items for the 2026 UTME underscores JAMB's determination to combat examination malpractice and uphold the integrity of its examinations. It is imperative for candidates and officials to adhere strictly to these regulations to ensure a fair and transparent examination process. JAMB's continued vigilance in enforcing these measures is crucial for maintaining the credibility and reliability of the UTME results.
