


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



PUNCH NEWSPAPER MONDAY MARCH 13TH, 2023 - Poll Postponement: More Varsities Shift Resumption Date: Following the announcement of the postponement of the 2023 governorship and Houses of Assembly elections by the Independent National Electoral Commission, more universities across the country have continued to announce an extension of the earlier resumption date proposed by the National Universities Commission.

The PUNCH reports that prior to the postponement of the 2023 governorship elections by INEC, the NUC had instructed universities in the country to suspend academic activities between February 22 and March 14, 2023.

However, findings by our correspondent revealed that following the postponement of the governorship elections, universities across the country have announced new resumption dates for students.

PUNCH NEWSPAPER MONDAY MARCH 13TH, 2023 - Borno, Taraba, Bayelsa Lead In 2023 UTME Registration: Ahead of the 2023 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examinations for the admissions into the 2023/2024 academic session in tertiary institutions across the country, data obtained from the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board revealed that 10 states presented less than 200,000

candidates for the examinations.

Based on the data from the Board, the 10 states are Borno with 16,793 candidates; Taraba (16,686); Bayelsa (16,494); Adamawa (15,504); Jigawa (13,983); Kebbi (13,482); Sokoto (13,042); Ebonyi (11,172); Yobe (10,522), and Zamfara (4,988).

GUARDIAN NEWSPAPER TUESDAY MARCH 14TH, 2023 - JAMB Postpones UTME Mock To March 30: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has postponed the 2023 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) Mock to March 30. It was originally scheduled for this Thursday.

JAMB spokesman, Fabian Benjamin, in a statement, explained: "The shift in date is partly owing to the change in the date for the gubernatorial and state Houses of Assembly elections earlier scheduled to hold on Saturday, March 11, 2023 but now moved to March 18.

He said candidates, who registered early and indicated willingness to take the test, would be notified as to when to print their notification slips containing centres and other details. The mock is an optional examination introduced by JAMB to provide opportunity for candidates to have hands-on experience and ascertain the Board's readiness and that of its partners for the main UTME, holding between April 29 and May 12.

Benjamin noted that this year's examination would witness

innovations geared at addressing infractions and centre failures.

His words, "For instance, in the new regime, if there is a delay of up to one hour before commencement of a particular session, that session stands cancelled and would be rescheduled along with candidates. "By same token, no examination can be started one hour after the scheduled commencement time. The session will be scheduled for any vacant or available slot. The Board has made it mandatory that candidates must be notified of their new scheduled session or centre, as the case may be, before they leave their centre. In addition, no candidate would be allowed to spend less than one hour before submission of responses during the UTME.

Similarly, the new regime would make it impossible for candidates to login after one hour of activation of examination.

"If for any reason, an examination session is cancelled or cannot hold, candidates are not to panic, as they will simply be scheduled for the next available session, which could be that same day. What such candidates are expected to do is to quietly leave the hall and move to the Holding Area to await further instruction.

Furthermore, they are not to leave the examination centre until they have been notified of the day and time of their rescheduled

examination.

"Candidates are to note that any rescheduled examination is strictly meant to accommodate only those whose examination session could not hold on account of one reason or the other, and not for those, who were marked late or absent for their

Prof. Boampong said the Association was at the Board's National Headquarters, Abuja, to interact with its leadership to map out strategies for the growth of the Association for the next three years.

He commended Prof.Oloyede fir his laudable role in the affairs of the Association. He described him as the architect and founder of AWAU, adding that the Association would not have come to be without the Registrar.

He advised Africans to take their destiny in their own hands and implored those who choose to study outside the continent to look inwards rather than opting for institutions outside Africa.

"We have the resources, the infrastructure, and the human capital to compete with our peers across the world. What we have may not may not be 100 percent. However, what we have is enough. If

we appreciate what we have and work together, we can educate our people. That doesn't mean we cannot go outside the continent as we also need the exposure, which will help us learn new things but we can bring them home to improve our system. It is by so doing that the continent could end its economic dependence on non-African countries,"he stated.

In her remarks, the Director of Administration, AWAU, and Vice Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Akure, Prof. Adenike Oladeji, underscored the enormous benefits of membership of the Association in the sub-region. She stressed that series of conferences held by AWAU, had fostered not only academic exchanges through networking and global exposure but also helped to reshape policy direction and implementation of member institutions.

Prof. Oladeji also stated that JAMB had been a strong pillar in the various inroads AWAU had recorded and called for suggestions, ideas from the Board to strengthen the Association to achieve its vision and mandate.

2023 UTME: BRACE UP FOR OUR REFORMS - JAMB REGISTRAR TELLS NSCDC



head of the 2023 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), the Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board(JAMB), has called on the Nigerian Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC) as a critical stakeholder, to brace up for the series of reforms that have been introduced in this year's examination.

The Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, at a meeting with NSCDC on Tuesday, 14th March, 2023, hinted that the 2023 UTME might look challenging but is actually friendly on account of the various innovations put in place to enhance its sanctity. He appealed to stakeholders and candidates alike

to support the Board in its drive for excellence.

The Board's helmsman also reiterated that the scheduled commencement time of its examination is sacrosanct and is not negotiable. He said if by any reason the examination cannot hold as scheduled either due to negligence of the Board's permanent or ad-hoc staff, candidates would be moved to the Holding Hall where they would be expected to wait for the announcement of the date and time for their rescheduled examination. However, he stated that candidates, who were late ab initio would not be eligible to sit the examination.

Similarly, the Registrar disclosed that the Board would run four sessions per

day and called for diligence on the part of the men and officers of the NSCDC adding that candidates in failed or turbulent sessions would be moved to the fourth session.

He said the appeal to the NSCDC personnel, who would be engaged for the exercise, was to get them to be punctual, committed, meticulous and to display a high and moral ethical standards as they are the first contact point for the candidates as they arrive the examination venue for screening and eventual clearance to the examination hall.

The Registrar urged the NSCDC to display a high level of professionalism stating that problems might come but they could be easily surmounted once the right mechanisms are in place.

The Registrar expressed appreciation for the great role being played by the NSCDC towards the success of the UTME and urged them to see their engagements as a call to national duty.

In his remarks, the Deputy Commandant-General (DCG) Operations, Mr. Dauda Mungadi pledged the support of the corps to the success of the Board's examination. The DCG promised to look into all issues raised by the Registrar saying, "We would not disappoint the Board as he assured the Board of the corps commitment.

Education Commission (UBEC), recently launched the SMART Schools Initiative to close the gaps in Information Communication Technology training among Early Childhood Education (ECD) pupils and Junior Secondary School students across all the country.

Consequently, the Commission had entered into a capacity-building relationship with the Board to conduct a selection examination for teachers that would be engaged for the programme in Osun State.

Speaking with JAMBullettin at the venue of the exercise, the Osun State Executive Secretary, UBEC, disclosed that the Commission had conducted the examination to select the best hands for the programme.

In his words, "We cannot afford to fail in the SMART Schools Initiative that is why we have decided to test the Information Technology (IT) proficiency of interested teachers. This is solely because the SMART Schools would be equipped with the latest IT gadgets."

Speaking further, he stated that the SMART Schools were to be established in the six geopolitical zones of the country in addition to one per State, including the Federal Capital Territory (FCT). FEW FACTS ABOUT JAMB

- 繳 The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) was established for the general control of the conduct of matriculation examinations for admissions into all universities, polytechnics, monotechnics, colleges of education and (recently added) Innovation **Enterprise Institutes (IEIs).**
- 90 Section 5 (2)of the ACT establishing the Board provided as stated: For the avoidance of doubt, the Board shall be responsible for determining matriculation requirements and conducting examinations leading to undergraduate admissions and also for admissions to National Diploma and the Nigerian Certificate in Education courses, but shall not be responsible for examinations or any other selective process for postgraduate courses and any other courses offered by the tertiary institutions. In the implementation of this section, there is always a synergy with the National Universities Commission(NUC), the National Board for Technical Education(NBTE) and the National Commission for Colleges of Education(NCCE) with the endorsement of the National Council on Education(NCE).
- In exercising this power, the Board is always guided by admission guidelines approved by the Policy Meeting under the Chairmanship of the Hon. Minister of Education with all Heads of Tertiary Institutions and other stakeholders in attendance.
- Since the inception of the Interim Joint Matriculation Board Examination (IJMBE), JAMB appoints moderators for all its questions as well as the grading of candidates scores. It has always done this without failing to still accommodate 'HSC' within the current 6-3-3-4 system. The National Council on Education(NCE) guidelines for the Joint Universities Preliminary Examinations Board (JUPEB) also endorsed the practice for JUPEB.
- The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board shall continue to operate within its laws.

In his remarks, the Regional Manager of the Pension Fund Administrator, Mr. Opatola Oladipo, disclosed that choosing the Administrator offers a variety of retirement benefits as well as rest of mind to the staff, stressing that the PFA was one of the largest in Nigeria with a proven track record.

He corroborated the assertion of Ms. Ugboaja that CPS would be beneficial to all workers at retirement especially those operating under the Stanbic PFA, while urging those who were not currently operating with the PFA to. ome on board for them to benefit from a wide range of opportunities the PFA offers.

Earlier in his remarks, the Acting Director/Coordinator of JAMB NHA, Lagos, Mr. Billiaminu Shittu, noted that it was in the best interest of all staff of the Board to be aware of the various pension benefits available to them before retirement. Baba, you are greatly missed. I thought your calls would continue even after the last ones you made to me.

May your soul rest in peace, "Baba n Baba PLC" as we fondly say of you for your devotion and application of your whole energies to work to tutor us on the imperative of working and always working.

May God Almighty grant you peaceful rest, and grant the family the fortitude to bear the loss. Amen. Rest on Sir, "Baba n Baba PLC." Adieu, Sir.

To successfully achieve the noble objectives of all the innovations put in place, the Board would want to use this opportunity to appeal for the understanding of the public as it implements these very far-reaching solutions, which have the potential of turning around the fortunes of education in the country.

It is against this backdrop that the Board would like to restate its determination to follow through with its earlier pronouncement that no candidate would be allowed to login to the examination one hour into the stipulated examination start time. This is meant as a corollary to its earlier directive that no candidate would be allowed to enter the examination hall one hour into the examination start time.

In addition, the Board, in order to holistically check impersonation, only candidates who have been biometrically verified successfully, would be able to login for the examination.

NIGERIA POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION DATA SYSTEM (NIPEDS)

Pollowing the enormity of the challenges associated with the A 'level qualifications and stakeholders determined efforts to address it, an A 'level bank was instituted under the chairmanship of the former Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Prof Muhammad Yahuza Bello, which has now been converted to the Nigeria Post-secondary Education Data System (NIPEDS).

The conversion to NIPEDS is to streamline the functions of the A 'level bank in line with international standard thereby bringing total sanity to the entire process of A 'level qualifications that has been fraudulently manipulated by some candidates to gain undue advantage in securing admission into Year Two programme in the university.



INNOVATIONS IN THE UTME AND A CALL FOR UNDERSTANDING



t will be recalled that the Board had started upgrading its operational processes since 2017, and as is usual with change, it came with some challenges including resistance. Given public support and understanding, the Board since 2018 has reached the cruising level. However, there is always room for improvement and the Board has decided to move to the next stage of its technological transformation.

The next stage requires all hands to be on deck as we take some crucial steps. The Board has developed some measures to be deployed during the 2023 UTME exercise, despite the fact that the innovations have been tested, it is obvious that some hiccups would be experienced as was the case in 2017 when some critical changes were effected.

Though the Board has put the necessary mechanisms on ground to address any unforeseen circumstances, it is soliciting the understanding of the public particularly the candidates.

Improvement can hardly be made which had been rescheduled without some sacrifices, hence the need to solicit for this understanding as the Board deploys its latest technology for the examination.

One of the major features of the new

dispensation is that no examination would be allowed to take place after one hour of its scheduled start time because the Board has discovered that some of the problems reported at the centres are contrived to delay the commencement of a session in some centres with a view to securing undue advantage for the delayed candidates.

Consequently, any examination that, for whatever reason, could not take place within one hour is automatically rescheduled. When such occurs, affected candidates are expected to file out of the examination hall into the waiting hall and await the new scheduled time and date which most likely would be the same date or next. The candidates are to only go out to print their new schedule after they have been notified of their rescheduled examination.

Candidates, who had been marked late or absent for the session, cannot take advantage of the rescheduling as there would be no questions to answer for such candidates as they had not undergone screening for the earlier scheduled examination which had been rescheduled. JAMB has made an additional session a vailable every day to accommodate such fallouts.

CESSATION OF ILLEGAL/IRREGULAR ADMISSIONS

- All applications of admissions to First Degree, National Diploma, National Innovation Diploma and the Nigeria Certificate in Education into Full-Time, Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc., must be processed ONLY through the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advertise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.
- It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
