

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

at the National Headquarters of the Board on a working visit. According to her, such a visit was necessary in view of the strategic importance of the Board to the telecommunication aiant.

Ms Oyeniyi pointed out that MTN was committed to engendering shared prosperity among its partners, and is, therefore, committed to charting a roadmap aimed at assisting JAMB to deliver on its mandate through a partnership that work through efficient and quality service delivery.

According to her, the visit would enable MTN to take stock of its obligations to the Board and, by so doing, review those areas that need to be strengthened with a view to having a hitch-free 2024 registration and examination exercises.

In his remarks, the Board's IT Consultant, Mr Damilola Bamiro, thanked the delegation for the visit and commended the existing synergy between both organisations.

Mr Bamiro, however, listed areas of collaboration which needed critical interventions from MTN. According to him, some of the listed concerns had been addressed while some are ongoing.

Earlier, the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, who was represented on the occasion by the Director of Finance and Accounts, Mr Mufutau Bello, said the two bodies had enjoyed a robust partnership spanning several years and urged both sides to sustain the tempo by addressing those areas of concern as identified by the Board with a view to having a rancour-free 2024 registration and examination exercises.

# BE PRUDENT IN YOUR FINANCES - FINANCIAL EXPERT ADVISE STAFF

n line with the commitment of the Board to instilling a culture of financial prudence among its staff nationwide, the Abia State Office of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), on Friday, 15th September, 2023, paid host to a team of financial experts from First Bank PLC.

The leader of the team, Mr. Eze Uchechukwu, in his address urged the staff to cultivate the habit of saving and investing in portfolios that are beneficial and profitable, stressing that these financial packages are very useful in the execution of contingency plans and a ddressing unforeseen contingencies.

According to him, one of such portfolios is the Children University Educational Plan, where an account holder sets the amount to be saved and fully or gradually contribute same till a future date when the children are of university age and use same to fund their university education. He explained that in case of death before the fulfilment of this obligation, the Next of Kin, through the guardian, would be given the total amount set by the account holder as well as the accruing interest from such savings.

Speaking further, Mr. Eze stated that the Personal Investment Plan is another package, which allows an account holder to have periodic access to the savings for the execution of projects. He said that the duration of this plan is six years and the savings can only be accessed partly by the 4th year while 25% of the savings is paid in the fifth year and the balance paid by the sixth year.

He disclosed further that the Personal Retirement Fund is specifically designed for staff with longer years of service. He noted that this portfolio affords staff the opportunity to make enough savings before retirement.

Mr. Eze explained that all the aforementioned financial packages have insurance cover and, therefore, encouraged staff to take advantage of them as well as visit their website and social media platforms for further information.

In his remarks, the Abia State Coordinator, Mr. Johnson Adebiyi, expressed appreciation to the facilitators for organising the interactive session and urged staff to leverage on these financial packages to secure their future.

Disbursement: The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) and the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) have resolved to committee to fashion out modalities for speedy disbursement of the students loan to beneficiaries.

The decision to set up the technical committee was taken when both agencies of government held a meeting in Abuja as part of the efforts to actualise the provisions of the Higher Education Act 2023, otherwise known as Students Loan Act, one of the first bills President Bola Ahmed Tinubu assented to soon after his resumption to office on May 29, 2023.

The students' loan scheme which takes effect in barely a fortnight (October 1, 2023), provides interest-free education loans for Nigerians willing to acquire tertiary education while they pay in installments two years after their participation in the National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) programme. # ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR EMERGENCY TRANSFER OF RETURNEE NIGERIAN STUDENTS INTO NIGERIAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM IN TIME OF CRISIS

Please find below the procedure for processing transfer of Returnee Nigerian Students into Nigerian University system in time of crisis:

- A prospective student travelling abroad for undergraduate studies normally registers (document his/her travel) with the Federal Ministry of Education (FME) and obtains a Document ID. It is called "Notification to Study Abroad". In case of crises such registration becomes helpful.
- 2. Anyone who did not but has now become a returnee who is desirous of transfer into a Nigerian University must do a retroactive registration with the Federal Ministry of Education as follows:
  - Go to FME website www.education.gov.ng
  - Go to attestation of academic documents or <a href="http://.ess.education.gov.ng">http://.ess.education.gov.ng</a>
  - Tick the certificates you want to evaluate (Tick your highest qualification in Nigeria to enable you pick a date)
  - Pick a date
  - Make payment via remittal RRR code
  - Print Appointment Slip
  - Go to FME Revenue Unit 2nd floor
  - Go to 8<sup>th</sup> floor Evaluation Accreditation Division with original copies of your credentials base on your Date of Appointment

- 3. Returnee Student visits Returnee Application page on IBASS from JAMB website: www.jamb.gov.ng
- 4. In the IBASS page, the Returnee Student uploads the registration slip obtained from the FME and then completes the Returnee Transfer Personal data:
  - a. Name
  - b. NIN
  - c. Telephone Number
  - d. Active e-mail address
  - e. Current University
  - f. Country and City of Study
  - g. Programme
  - h. Year of Entry
  - i. Current Level of Study
- 5. Returnee Student selects intended University of Choice and Programme.
- 6. Returnee Student uploads scanned copy of the following documents:
  - a. Current University Admission letter;
  - b. Transcript/Student Semester Results;
  - c. Data page of International Passport; and
  - d. Sworn Affidavit (confirming the genuineness of information supplied and that insincere or false information shall lead to withdrawal from studies and/or of certificates (in the event of issuance). Prosecution may also follow.
- 7. Returnee Student clicks SUBMIT button, which now sends an email to intended University of Choice for Request for Application to Apply for Inter-University Transfer.

- 8. Notification page for successful request is loaded and presented on the screen by IBASS System.
- 9. Returnee Student gets a notification email and SMS for his/her application request sent to the intended University of Choice.
- 10. Student's University of Choice gets an IBASS mail of the Student's Request for Application to Apply for Inter-University Transfer
- 11. Intended University evaluates Student's credentials for possible consideration.
- 12. If the Intended University of Choice is satisfied/unsatisfied with the credentials presented by the Returnee Student, a notification is sent on <u>JAMB-IBASS-mail for</u> Qualified/Unqualified for consideration.
- 13. Qualified Returnee Student is directed via the email and SMS to approach any JAMB Office (in person) to complete the Inter-University Transfer Application.

**Note** that the process is tracked by JAMB, NUC and the candidate as follows:

- (a) Submitted (b) Being reviewed by the University
  - (c) Successful/Unsuccessful
- 14. The intended University of Choice then follows the Advisory on <u>Inter-University</u> Transfer of Students earlier sent to the institutions in 2019 (see attached).

# ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION FOR FOREIGN INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER FOR STALITES (NOT FRESHERS)

Please find below the procedure for application for foreign inter-University transfer for Stalites:

- 1. The proposed institution sends a list of all candidates (not Freshers) for foreign Inter-University transfer to State JAMB Office with a letter of indemnity.
- 2. The proposed institution directs each candidate to State JAMB Office to create his/her profile on efacility platform (Candidate not on the list earlier sent by the proposed institution would be rejected by the State JAMB Office and cannot process any application on the system).
- 3. At State JAMB Office, the candidate fills the INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER APPLICATION FORM FOR STALITES (NOT FRESHERS) FROM FOREIGN UNIVERSITIES online which would be available only at the State JAMB Office (Note that only the State JAMB Office that the institution is located can attend to the candidates).
- 4. Each candidate is expected to print and submit the auto-generated Indemnity Form after completing the application to his/her Current and Proposed Institutions for the signature of the Heads of the Institutions to indemnify JAMB on the accuracy of the information provided by the candidate. The form is to be endorsed first by the current institution.
- 5. The Proposed Institution sends the endorsed and indemnified form to the Coordinator of the State JAMB Office.
- 6. The form is uploaded from the State JAMB Office to the Headquarters and made available to the efacility platform for processing.
- 1. If the application is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email.
- 2. The candidate can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

According to the State Coordinator, the training was organised to reawaken the consciousness of staff to the extant rules and regulations of the Board as well as enlighten them on the need for their unalloyed loyalty in ensuring the implementation of its policies and directives.

Furthermore, Mr. Adebiyi noted that the Board, as an agency of government, was empowered by law to carry out specified mandates and it is the duty of all staff to ensure the realisation of these organisational objectives. He added that the Board's Management cannot carry out these mandates alone without the support of staff, who are pivotal to the implementation of these policies.

The State Coordinator stressed that sanctions on any erring staff. the Public Service Rules (PSR)

He also urged them to embrace teamwork and avoid working at cross purposes, which he said would ensure enhanced service delivery by the Board.

## THE REGISTRAR, PROF. IS-HAQ OLARENWAJU OLOYEDE, FNAL, CON CORDIALLY INVITES ALL STAKEHOLDERS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC TO THE FIRST (1ST) NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON EQUAL OPPORTUNITY OF ACCESS TO HIGHER **EDUCATION IN NIGERIA**

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), through its Equal Opportunity Group (JEOG), has been conducting the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) for blind candidates and others with disabilities such as autism and Down syndrome. The aim is to ensure that no eligible Nigerian is denied the opportunity of taking the UTME regardless of disability.

The efforts have been quite successful, as JEOG has processed about 2,500 candidates for the UTME, with over a third admitted to courses of their choice in higher education institutions in Nigeria (mainly universities). The average admission rate of 34.3% for blind candidates is higher than the national average for all candidates over the same period. The good news does not stop with the admission of the candidates reports from some universities and other tertiary institutions indicate that the admitted blind candidates compete favourably with their non-blind counterparts.

Despite these laudable achievements, a lot more needs to be done by all stakeholders. Areas requiring improvements include participation by more institutions in the admission and training of candidates with special needs; improving the learning environment for such candidates; and expanding the base of candidates serviced by JAMB through JEOG.

To address these problems and many others, JAMB plans to periodically organise National Conference on Equal Opportunity of Access to Higher Education (NCEOAHE).

The first of such conferences is scheduled to hold between 26th and 27th September, 2023 at Ladi Kwali Hall, Abuja Continental Hotel, Abuja, FCT (formerly Sheraton Abuja Hotel). The theme of this first conference is Towards Increasing Equal Opportunity of Access to Higher Education in Nigeria. Its aim is to improve access to higher education for persons with special needs and to improve the learning environment in tertiary institutions for such persons. The objectives of this pioneer national conference include the following:

- a) To undertake situation analysis of opportunities and access to higher education of persons with special needs especially the blind, albinos, persons with autism, Down syndrome and physically challenged and others in correctional centres;
- b) To discuss the challenges facing candidates with special needs in gaining admission into Nigerian tertiary institutions and share experiences on modalities of admission and retention of persons with disabilities;
- c) To discuss the challenges confronting students with special needs in the Nigerian higher education system and
- propose sustainable solutions to increased access of students with special needs to quality higher education; and
  d) To propose changes that can be made to national policies that will address inequities in opportunities and equal access to higher education especially by the blind, albinos, persons with autism, Down syndrome the physically challenged and others in correctional centres.

The Strategic Roadmap for Inclusive Access to Quality Higher Education in Nigeria (2024 – 2028) will be unveiled during the Conference

- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advertise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. - It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above.
