According to him, the eagle eyes of the Board are watching and would always catch perpetrators of any unwholesome practices, who are hell-bent on compromising the sanctity of its processes.

The Registrar, who made the disclosure while fielding questions from journalists on Wednesday 24th May, 2023, prior to the commissioning of the facility, said each of the four Nasiru El-Rufa'i Holding Halls adjoining the PTCs could conveniently take at least, 250 participants, as such, the Board would be renting them out for the purpose of recouping its investment in the project.

Furthermore, Prof. Oloyede disclosed that the Board would also be erecting a Guest House within the complex to cater for the accommodation needs of its teeming clients and stakeholders at affordable price.

"It is hoped that these projects and many others including the proposed Direct Entry Guest House, would give the National Headquarters Annex, Kaduna, a pride of place among other facilities of the Board, " he stated.

The Muhammadu Buhari 1000seater Mega Professional Testing Centres 1-4 and the Nasiru El-Rufa'i Holding Halls 1-4 Complexes were commissioned by His Excellency, Mallam Nasiru El-Rufa'i, the Executive Governor of Kaduna State. Earlier in his remarks, Prof. Oloyede explained that each of the Nasiru El-Rufa'i Holding Halls 1-4 was attached to each of the four Professional Testina Centres of the Muhammadu Buhari 1000-seater respectively, therefore, candidates assigned to sit their examination in any of the PTCs would not be able to mingle with those assigned to other halls.

He also made it known that each of

the Professional Testing Centres not only had its own adjoined holding hall but also a registration point. As such, instead of the standard ten candidates that could be registered at a go in other JAMB-accredited Computer-Based Test (CBT) centres, 40 candidates would be registered cumulatively at the Mega PTCs for prompt and efficient service delivery.

"The three projects we are commissioning today therefore consist of: four distinct fully equipped, Professional Test Centres with combined seats of one thousand one hundred (1.100), four well-equipped Holding Halls with a cumulative capacity of one thousand (1000) seats, four **Professional Registration Centres** (Biometric/Prometric Centres) capable of processing 40 registrants simultaneously, four fully-equipped Control/Server Rooms, 500 KVA Generators (with 8 units of 9KVA generators), 500 KVA dedicated transformer, 10KVA solar facilities to serve as alternative independent power sources; and 100 Extra Systems/Servers and other accessories for the use of the centres."

"It is therefore, my pleasure to announce the commissioning of this



edifice, which is dedicated to the administration of e-exam to 1000 candidates in one sitting. This is not only a boost to the Board's efforts at deepening the use of CBT in the conduct of large-scale examinations in Nigeria but also one that would also substantially contribute to the efforts of the State Government to facilitate digital literacy, among many other possibilities."

"The complex is the largest so far in the country, if not in Africa and with the spate at which we will be concentrating on infrastructure and manpower development, a time is coming when UTME would be conducted in just one session in any given year rather than the current multiple sessions," he disclosed.

Other notable dignitaries at the event include: Distinguished Senator Mallam Uba Sani, the Governor-Elect, Kaduna State; Mr.

The registration impersonation suspects are Timilehin Akinwale, Olayinka Mustapha and Peter Okereke, while Feranmi Adesuyi was arraigned for examination impersonation.

According to the charge sheet, the first three defendants committed the impersonation act on Feb.15 at Aina

Awaw International College, Ilu Abo, Akure, which was a CBT centre for JAMB registration and examination.

It said that the offense was contrary to section 3(3)(c) of Examination Malpractice Act, Cap E15, LFN, 2004 and punishable under the same section.

Also, Feranmi Adesuyi committed the said offense on April 28 at Amable Nig. Ltd CBT Centre in Owo...

The council said it had never claimed that public schools were not also guilty of examination malpractices but the fact remains that private schools are worse comparatively.

The Head of Public Affairs Department of WAEC Nigeria, Mrs. Moyosola Adesina, made this clarification as a response to an earlier report by Tribune Online and credited to the National President of National Association of Proprietors of Private Schools (NAPPS), Yomi Otubela, that WAEC always accused private schools of aiding examination malpractice and make it appears as if public schools are not involving in the practice.

he increasing spate of factionalisation among students has been described as unhealthy and capable of stunting their progress and aspirations. JAMB TRAINS STAFF ON PRESENTATION ETHICS AND TOOLS

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), on Friday, 26th May, 2023, held its May edition of its monthly seminar/workshop at the National Headquarters Auditorium, Bwari Abuja.

The May edition with the title: "Best Practice in Presentation Ethics and Tools for Administrators" was aimed at educating staff on how to make standard presentations through the deployment of knowledge and tools necessary to deliver engaging and ethically sound presentations.

Earlier, the Registrar, Prof. Ish-aq Oloyede, who was represented by the Director, Special Duties, Dr. Mrs. Beatrice Okorie, in his opening remarks, enjoined all participants to p a y rapt attention to the presentation as it would prove useful to them in the course of their career in the civil service. He added that the monthly seminars/workshops is designed to educate staff on various topics that are aimed at enhancing their productivity and make them better administrators.

The May 2023 edition of the monthly seminar/workshop edition was presented by Dr. Mrs. Bosede Oyeteju Amoo, MMIM, a visiting Director, from the Lagos State University. In her presentation, Dr. Amoo said that the thrust of her paper was to provide administrators with valuable insights and practical strategies for enhancing their presentation skills, while maintaining high ethical standards.

According to her, a standard presentation must convey ideas in an effective, meaningful and persuasive way, build trust as well as build credibility with the audience.

"For effective communication, the presenter should present accurate, relevant, and reliable information, engage his audience as well as respect diverse perspectives through the promotion of inclusivity, among others."

Speaking on the ethical considerations in presentations, she said that transparency and integrity in information sharing, citing sources and giving credit, avoiding misrepresentation or manipulation of data, and avoiding stereotypes are very important ethical consideration a presenter should always note.

As for the tools and technology for enhancing presentations, Dr. Amao cited: PowerPoint, KeyNote - a program which, like PowerPoint, is used to create digital screen presentations. It is mainly used by Apple users, Canva, which is an Australian global multi-national graphic design platform used to create social media graphics and presentations, as well as Prezi - a web-based tool for creating presentations similar to the Microsoft PowerPoint, but which offers some unique features that make it a good alternative.

She urged participants to always apply best practices in presentation design especially through the use of visual design principles such as consistency in colour, font, and layout and making effective use of visuals, charts, and graphs, creating engaging slide content by deploying limited text and concise bullet points and visuals to enhance understanding while utilising multimedia and other interactive such as videos, audio clips, and animations or through polls or interactive slides".

In her closing remarks, Dr. Amao urged participants to up their game through sound mastery of presentation techniques so as not to be caught unawares when they are asked to make presentations on behalf of the Board, among others.

before Justice T.B. Adegoke of the Federal High Court, Akure Judicial Division, had conspired to complete their registrations which they started at Amable CBT centre, Owo, at Aina Awaw CBT Centre, Ilu-Abo, in order to impersonate their clients during the 2023 UTME.

Other defendants arraigned alongside Feranmi Adesuyi were Okereke Peter, Akinwale Timilehin, and Mustapha Olayinka Idris.

The suspects, Timilehin Akinwale, Olayinka Mustapha, Peter Okereke and Feranmi Adesuyi were arraigned for impersonation.

According to the charge sheet, the first three defendants committed the impersonation act on 15th February, 2023, at Aina Awaw International College, Ilu Abo, Akure, which was a CBT centre for JAMB registration and examination.

The charge sheet reads: "That you OKEREKE PETER (m), 29yrs, AKINWALE TIMILEHIN(m), 22yrs and MUSTAPHA OLAYINKA IDRIS (m), 23yrs, on or about the 15th day of February, 2023, at AINA AWAW INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE ILLU-ABO, a CBT Centre for JAMB Registration and Examination, Akure, Ondo State, within the jurisdiction of this Honourable Court did impersonated FOLARIN DAMILOLA, KAZEEM IMISI OLAMILEKAN and TIJANI BABATUNDE SEUN respectively during JAMB CBT registration, contrary to Section 3(3)(c) of Examination Malpractice Act, Cap E15, LFN, 2004 and punishable under the same section."

Feranmi Adesuyi, on the other hand, committed the same offense of impersonation to sit the examination for his sponsor on 28th April, 2023, at Amable Nig. Ltd., CBT Centre, Owo, during the 2023 JAMB UTME.

According to the charge sheet, "That you FERANMI ADESUYI (m), 29yrs, on or about the 28th day of April, 2023, at AMABLE NIG. LTD CBT CENTRE, Owo, during the 2023 JAMB Examination in Ondo State, within the Jurisdiction of this Honourable Court did conspire with one SANUSI TUNDE who is now at large, to complete his registration and also impersonate the said SANUSI TUNDE for the JAMB Exam and thereby committed an offence contrary to Section 10 of the Examination Malpractices Act, Cap E15, LFN, 2004 and punishable under Section 3(2)(c) of the Examination Malpractice Act, Cap E15 Laws of Federation of Nigeria, 2004."

The accused persons pleaded not guilty to the charge.

The prosecuting counsel, Moses Osimhen, urged the court to remand the suspects at Olokuta Prison pending the date for hearing of the substantive matter.

The defendants' counsel, Clement Falana and Austin Agbounghale, however, pleaded with the court to grant the suspects bail as their alleged offence was bailable.

The presiding judge, Justice T. B. Adegoke, thereafter ordered the suspects to be remanded at Olokuta Prison and adjourned the case till 12th July for hearing.

t was a day of praise and celebration for the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) as its 1000-seater mega Professional Testing Centres (PTCs) was commissioned by the Kaduna State Governor, Malam Nasiru Ahmed El-Rufa'i.

Furthermore, he acknowledged the efforts of the Board in sanitising the nation's admission process through the adoption of innovative strategies.

"The Board has demonstrated capacity and determination and all it needs at this moment is the support of all. It is the prudent management of resources that provided the means for the Board to conceive and fund the project." "It is no longer news that the Board today is a leading light in the management of public resources given the number of projects it has executed despite its humongous remittances to the public coffers," he disclosed. The Muhammadu Buhari Mega Professional Testing Centre Complex is the largest in West Africa with four units each of 250-seater examination halls, which can seat one thousand candidates at the same time while an equal number of candidates wait to sit their examination at the adjoining Nasiru El-Rufai Holding Halls. This will enable the Board conduct examination for a cumulative figure of four thousand candidates per day.

Since the introduction of the Computer-Based Testing mode in 2013, the Board has built a total of thirty-two CBT centres across the six geopolitical zones of the country. These are:North-Central: seven centres of 250 capacity each; North-East: four centres, one centre of 250 capacity and three centres of 500 capacity; North-West: five centres, three centres of 250 capacity, one centre of 500 capacity and one centre of 1000 capacity; South-East: five centres, one centre of 250 capacity, three centres of 500 capacity and one centre of 750 capacity; South-South: three CBT centres, one centre of 250 capacity and two centres of 500 capacity; and finally the South-West: eight centres, five centres of 250 capacity and three centres of 500 capacity.

FEW FACTS ABOUT JAMB

- 劔 The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) was established for the general control of the conduct of matriculation examinations for admissions into all universities, polytechnics, monotechnics, colleges of education and (recently added) Innovation **Enterprise Institutes (IEIs).**
- Section 5 (2) of the ACT establishing the Board provided as stated: For the avoidance of 劔 doubt, the Board shall be responsible for determining matriculation requirements and conducting examinations leading to undergraduate admissions and also for admissions to National Diploma and the Nigerian Certificate in Education courses, but shall not be responsible for examinations or any other selective process for postgraduate courses and any other courses offered by the tertiary institutions. In the implementation of this section, there is always a synergy with the National Universities Commission(NUC), the National Board for Technical Education(NBTE) and the National Commission for Colleges of Education(NCCE) with the endorsement of the National Council on Education(NCE).
- 劔 In exercising this power, the Board is always guided by admission guidelines approved by the Policy Meeting under the Chairmanship of the Hon. Minister of Education with all Heads of Tertiary Institutions and other stakeholders in attendance.
- 劔 Since the inception of the Interim Joint Matriculation Board Examination (IJMBE), JAMB appoints moderators for all its questions as well as the grading of candidates scores. It has always done this without failing to still accommodate 'HSC' within the current 6-3-3-4 system. The National Council on Education(NCE) guidelines for the Joint Universities Preliminary Examinations Board (JUPEB) also endorsed the practice for JUPEB.
 - The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board shall continue to operate within its laws.

Another pertinent takeaway from the Congress is the increased capacity of the Board to shore up its current media strategies especially in the light of the recent innovations to better protect the sanctity of its

processes, which the public did not initially readily relate with, among others. However, in the final analysis, the Board was vindicated as its strategies were largely successful as it was, for instance, able to unmask the modus operandi of vested interests in the Direct Entry value chain. This was made possible by the Board's strategy of putting its ears to the ground and mounting effective countermeasures thereby ensuring that no candidate gains undue advantage over others.

RESUMPTION OF DIRECT ENTRY EXERCISE

You will recall that the Board commenced the 2023 Direct Entry registration on Monday, 20th February, 2023, but had to immediately suspend it following the discovery of the plethora of devices and machinations to circumvent and compromise the standard of A 'level qualifications required from DE candidates. Recall that recent joint operations of the Federal Ministry of Education and the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) on DE qualifications brought to light some of these unsavoury and nefarious activities. Bayero University, Kano (BUK) has also consistently brought to the fore the high rate of forgery of A'Level qualifications for DE.

2. For instance, it was discovered that, in previous years, some candidates used unacceptable and forged A' level certificates/qualifications to register for Direct Entry and eventually got admitted. For example out 148 candidates verified by BUK, only 6 were found to be genuine. By implication 142 of the results were forged. The Board, concerned stakeholders and institutions are working assiduously to detect such and the ones already found, are being dealt with according to the provisions of the law.

3. In order to further checkmate the anomaly and to also prevent recurrence of such irregularity, the Board has decided that the 2023 DE registrations will not only be restricted to JAMB PTCs but will also be done under strict supervision.

4. The Board has provided additional guidelines to all DE registration outlets (JAMB-owned centres), Officers of the Board and candidates on the 2023 Direct Entry registration exercise: -

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- i. At the point of registration, all candidates **must** fill in:
 - a) Registration/Matriculation Number of the previous school attended where the qualification was obtained;
 - b) Subject(s) of qualification;
 - c) Awarding Institution;
 - d) Institution actually attended.
- ii. The Board will only recognise and accept thirteen (13) qualifications/certificates for the 2023 Direct Entry registration exercise as highlighted in the table below:-

The conversion to NIPEDS is to streamline the functions of the A 'level bank in line with international standard thereby bringing total sanity to the entire process of A 'level qualifications that has been fraudulently manipulated by some candidates to gain undue advantage in securing admission into Year Two of the University Degree programmes.

INNOVATIONS IN THE UTME AND A CALL FOR UNDERSTANDING

It will be recalled that the Board has gradually upgraded its operational processes since 2017, and as is usual with change, it came with some challenges including resistance. Given public support and understanding, the Board since 2018 has reached the cruising level. However, there is always room for improvement and the Board has decided to move to the next stage of its technological transformation.

The next stage requires all hands to be on deck as we take some crucial steps. The Board has instituted some measures which are to be deployed during the 2023 UTME exercise. Despite the fact that the innovations have been tested and certified, yet it is not unlikely that some hiccups might spring up when the new technology is deployed live and nationwide. We therefore solicit your support and understanding as we promptly address any unforeseen circumstances. Hardly can there be growth without audacity and courage.

One major feature of the new dispensation is that no examination would be allowed to take place after one hour of its scheduled start time because the Board has discovered that some of the problems reported at the centres are contrived to delay the commencement of a session in some centres with a view to securing undue advantage for the delayed candidates.

Consequently, any session that, for whatever reason(s), could not take-off within one hour of its schedule is automatically rescheduled. When such occurs, affected candidates are expected to file out of the examination hall into the waiting hall and await the new scheduled time and place which most

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likely would be the same or following day. Candidates are expected not to disrupt subsequent sessions but to simply await information on reschedule. Parents have constituted major intrusion into the examination process. While we appeal for parents to keep-off the examination venues, we would not

The rescheduling does not permit a candidate who was initially marked absent during the screening to be part of the rescheduled session since the questions meant for such absentees have been withdrawn and not available for the rescheduled session.

hesitate to sanction the candidates and (parents) whose parents obstruct

In addressing possible rescheduling, an extra session has been created for every centre on every examination day.

In the meantime, the Board solicits the understanding and support of the public as it rolls out even more proactive policies for Topical issues of discussion at the Congress, among others, included: The AI Moment, Bringing AI into your Newsroom, Podcast Masterclass; The Big Idea; The Truth about Lies and Walking in the Shoes of Others.

Others were: Journalists in Exile: Innovation by Necessity; Global Spotlight: Press Freedom at Risk; Suddenly, it's All Tiktok all the Time: Where Does Journalism Fit; Using Al to Decode Disinformation; Cybercrime Laws: A New Frontline for Press Freedom and several others.

However, everything about the 72nd IPI World Congress was not all about digitisation as it also featured advocacy on the adoption of more human-inclined methods that would promote originality and expertise easily recognisable to identify falsifications and infractions in all their ramifications.

Also cardinal among the issues advocated by members of the International Press Institute (IPI), at the Congress and adopted by unanimous vote, was a resolution calling on state and non-state actors to cease the weaponization of the law to target journalists as well as respect human rights principles and frameworks aimed at safeguarding media freedom.

The Nigerian delegation was led by the President of IPI Nigeria, Mr. Musikilu Mojeed, who is also the Editor-in-Chief of Premium Times.

CESSATION OF ILLEGAL/IRREGULAR ADMISSIONS

- All applications of admissions to First Degree, National Diploma, National Innovation Diploma and the Nigeria Certificate in Education into Full-Time, Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc., must be processed ONLY through the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advertise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

ADVERTORIALS

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current UTME (or DE candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.
- It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is NOT allowed.
