

PUNCH TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020 -WAEC Withholds 215, 149 Candidates' Results, Records 65.24% Pass: The West African Examinations Council has said 65 .24 per cent of candidates who took the 2020 West African Senior School Certificate Examination obtained credits and above in a minimum of five subjects, including English Language and Mathematics. It also said the results of 215, 149 candidates were withheld.

It added that 86, 99 per cent of candidates who sat the examination obtained credit and above in a minimum of five subjects, not necessarily including English Language and Mathematics. According to the Council and following the return of normalcy in the states and FCT, the examinations will now continue with a new Time-Table from Monday 9th November 2020 to Saturday 28th November 2020.

PUNCH TUESDAY. NOVEMBER 3. 2020 -Poly Begins Sale of Local Rice: The Federal Polytechnic, Ede, Osun State, has commenced the sale of rice produced by the institution. The polytechnic also announced the acquisition of equipment for the preservation of food items, saying the project team had in the market rice in 5kg, 10kg and 25kg sizes.

The Rector of the polytechnic, Dr John Edaoogbogun, said the initiative would create a new source of internally generated revenue for the school as well as support the government and private individuals to produce food for the populace.

PUNCH TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020 -Umahi Slashes EBSU Tuition Fees: The Ebonyi State Governor, David Umahi, has slashed tuition fees of indigenes and nonindigenes students of Ebonyi State University, Abakaliki, by N20, 000 and N10, 000 respectively, for the 2020/2021 academic session. Umahi said the move would to cushion the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on students and their parents.

DAILY TRUST TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020 -UNILAG to Get N5billion for Critical Infrastructure- TETFUND: The Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND) has disclosed that the University of Lagos (UNILAG) would get N5billion special intervention fund in 2021 to build critical infrastructure. According to the Chairman, TETFund Board of Trustees, Alhaii Kashim Ibrahim-Imam. "UNILAG is our priority as it is one of the 12 centres of excellence spread across the country as each of these centres will focus on different research areas. For Lagos, it is biodiversity, conservation and ecosystem management. Our target in 2021 will be UNILAG as it will benefit from special interventions. TETFund is committing the sum of N1bn this year. Going forward, the University will get N5billion for critical infrastructure.

2020 - ATBU Bauchi Gets ICT Laboratory: Huawei Technologies Company Nigeria Limited, in collaboration with Galaxy Backbone Limited, has established an Information, Communications Technology (ICT) Academy Laboratory in Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University (ATBU). This followed the donation of a world-class ICT laboratory equipment to the ICT academy in ATBU, which would focus on helping students grow in their understanding and practice of Datacom, WLAN, Security, Cloud Computing,

Storage, Intelligent Computing, etc.

The Managing Director of Galaxy Backbone Limited, Professor Muhammad Abubakar, who contributed significantly to the partnership between both companies, said, "This year, Huawei took a step further and donated lab equipment to some universities that have been actively involved in ICT talents development and ATBU, Bauchi was selected as one of them. The equipment would avail the students of ATBU, Bauchi the opportunity to practice with live equipment and get a better understanding of the technology according to the industry standard.

2020 -Insecurity: Don't Leave Calabar, Avade Begs WAEC: Governor Ben Avade of Cross River State has appealed to the West Africa examinations Council (WAEC) not to relocate from Calabar to nearby Akwa Ibom State for alleged insecurity in the state.

WAEC had earlier announced that it would temporarily relocating its office in Calabar to Uyo, Akwa Ibom State due to attacks on its facilities.

Ayade, who visited the WAEC office in Calabar to assess the vandalised properties, promised to immediately provide an alternative office and two Hilux operational vehicles. He pleaded with the management of WAEC to shelve plans to relocate from the state.

2020 – TETFUND to Spend N277bn on 226 Institutions in 2021: The Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) has disclosed that it would spend about N277billion next year to provide critical infrastructure for 226 tertiary institutions across the country.

Chairman, Board of Trustees of TETFund, Alhaji Kashim Ibrahim-Imam stated that though the total budget for 2020 is N250 billion, they are hopeful to achieve the desired results around that sum by 2021 despite the COVID-19 outbreak. He stressed that the agency prioritised research activities in agriculture,

According to him, the goal set for Edo University, Iyamho is for the students to graduate with entrepreneurial skills that will make them not only entrepreneurs (selfemployed) but also employers of labour.


